A Proclamation for a general FAST.

PON Consideration as well of our Dependance on Almighty GOD for his Blessing on our Affairs and Interests, particularly in the Year ensuing, and the Duty incumbent on us, in a publick Manner to seek his Favour therein, as also of the many Frowns and Rebukes of Heaven upon this People in the Judgments with which we are now and have been long visited, and the sad Prospects of other Calamities impending;

have thought fit, with the Advice of his Pajelip's Council, to over and appoint Thursday the twenty third of April next, to be observed as a Day of Fatting and Prayer throughour this Province, exhorting both Ministers and People to folemnize the same in a religious and debout Panner, by deep humiliation, under the Sense of the debine Sipleasure and sincere Repentance of all our soins, by which we have proboked the Anger of SDD, and rendered ourselves obnoxious to his righteous Judgments, and by humble simportunate Supplications to the divine Pajelly for all necellary Biellings; particularly, That our Sovereign Lord the KING, and the Kingdoms and Dominions under his gracious Covernment may be alibays under the divine Protection and Fabour, That his Pajetty's Councils may be directed, and his Arms in the present War prospered; & more especially, That it would please GDD to give Success to the important Expedition against the Ring of Spain's Dominions in the West-Indies : That their Royal Dighnesses the Prince and Princes of Wales, and the rest of the royal Family may be preserved and blessed; That the Sovernment of this his watery's Province may be under the divine Influence and Direction in all their Administrations and just Enterprizes; That the Deligns of our Enemies may be defeated, and our Frontiers and Lea-Coaks fecured against any Attacks or Impressions from them, That health may be continued tohere it is now enjoyed, and restored to such places as are visited with Sickness, especially that awful Difference, whereby so many of the Children of this people have been cut off; That our were chandise and Mavigation may be defended and succeeded; and that GOD would grant us conbratent Seafons for our Husbandry, & in duc Time a plentiful Harvelt; and prosper the Works of our bands; And above all, That he would pour out his holy Spirit from onligh upon us; and that we may be a penitent and reformed people; and that the Kingdom of our Lord JESU's CHRI. T may be halined: And all ferbile Labour and Recreations are foldidden on the fait Day.

Given at the Council Chamber in Boffon, the Twenty-feventh Day of March 1741. In the Fourteenth Year of the Reign of Oar Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, KING Defender of the Faith, &c.
