HAVE therefore thought fit to issue this Proclamation, to the intent that all His Majesty's good Subjects within this Province may be fully apprized and informed of the said Treaty, so far as it concerns the Inhabitants of these His Majesty's American Dominions, that so those more immediately interested, may reap the Fruits and Benafits thereof; hereby Requiring all Persons whatsoever punctually to conform themselves thereunto.

And in pursuance of His Majesty's Commands signified in His Royal Letter to me directed, I do hereby strictly enjoyn all His Majesty's good Subjects within the Province aforesaid, to forbear and abstain from all Acts of Hostility against the Subjects of the King of Spain; And that if any Prize or Prizes have been or shall be taken from His said Catholick Majesty's Subjects since the Eleventh Day of June 2728, full Restitution be made of such Prize or Prizes, or in Default thereof, of the just Value of the said Prizes and their Cargoes at the Time when they were taken, according to the Authentick Proofs and Vouchers of such Valuation, that have been or shall be produced by the respective Owners of such vives and Cargoes who shall Claim the same; And that Reparation be given according to Justice for any surther Damage occasioned by the Detention of such Prizes till the Time of their being delivered up: Excepting always any Seizures that may have been or may be made on Account of any illegal Trade carried on contrary to the Laws and the Treaties of Peace and Commerce; And that the Owners of the Prizes to be restored, do in Pursuance hereof freely enjoy the same, and their Effects, and earry them at their Pleasure to their own Ports. And all and singular His Majesty's Officers and Ministers within this Province, and all others whom it may concern, are required to use their utmost Endeavours that His Majesty's Commands herein the strictly executed and observed. be strictly executed and obeyed,
