Of the ECLIPSES for the Year 1757.

HERE will be four Eclipses this Year, two of the Sun, and two of the Moon, in the following Order.

I. The First is of the Moon, the 4th Day of February in the Morning, visible. Calculated as follows, viz.

II. The Second will be of the Sun, the 18th Day of February, about 8 in the Morning, invisible.

VI. The Fourth and last will be of the Sun, the 14th Day of August, but Part of it visible, because the Sun will set before the Eclipse ends. This will be an Annular Eclipse, and nearly central. Calculated as follows, viz.

This will be a very rare Phenomenon, when the Middle of the Sun will be eclipsed, and a small bright Ring round the out Side thereof will appear. The like has not been seen in this Country before, neither will be again by Any now living.

HERE will appear a Comet (or blazing Star) in our Hemisphere some Time before the End of the Year 1758, which may perhaps appear toward the latter End of this Year 1757. The exact Time of its Appearance cannot be determined, by Reason that its Periods are unequal, as are also the Periods of all the other Comets that have been observed, which Inequality may be occasioned by the very great Eccentricity of their Orbits (or Trajectories) in which they move about the Sun, and their vast Distance from the Sun in their Aphelion. And their Orbits being very elliptical and extended vastly beyond this planetary System, they may perhaps pass so near to some Globes belonging to other Systems, as that their Motions may thereby be either retarded or accelerated; or the Comets in passing by each other, may, by the fundamental Law of Gravity, mutually attract each other, so as to quicken or retard each other's Motions. This Comet is the same that appeared in the Year 1782: Its Distance from the Sun in its Perihelium, is about 190 Million English Miles; and in its nearest Approach to the Earth, it may be about 109 Million Miles distant. As to the Nature of these Comets, they are terraqueous Globes, and the Tail or lucid Train, that attends them, is supposed to be occasioned by the Rays of the Sun being reflected from the Atmosphere of the Comet. They are supposed to be portentous of great Revolutions and Overtures, both in the natural and moral Worlds.
