FROM LONDON, MAY 5, 1869. The revocation of the Orders gives universal satisfaction—Except the blockade of France, Holland, and the Kingdom of Italy, (Naples not excluded) your trade is on the same footing as before the orders.

Mr. Zinckey approves the Orders and says the American government ought to be pleased with it. The affair of the Chesapeake, will be adjusted, and he hopes and expects that all is in a train for a final settlement.

Extract of a letter from a gentleman of extensive political information to his friend in Washington, dated, June 19th, 1869. The political state of this country and Portugal, I consider better than it has been for some time past.

A gentleman who arrived here yesterday in dispatch ship Pacific, informs, that the conduct of Col. Bvan had excited the suspicion of the British government; he was ordered to leave the country, and had embarked for Gothenburg.
