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Turefore ne judge it secching this wil faithful Prieses Could discover themseives to be true Confrant by having the l'alts of the Spirit of Christ, which are Love, Merg, Goodn! and Compasion towards all in Milery, and the fufe: Opentification and there Whige, to tar as in them is possible to in and refleve them and let them hee of their hard Bondage, wi excite it may be hoped, that many of them will be gained by their beholding their good Works of Sincere Christians, and presumed thereby, through the Presching the Golpel to the first to increase the true Fasth of Christ. And for this earn it it, respectables, ther in lome places in Europe Negrous terms to beight and fold for Minney, or detained to be 3 22 Secaule at twite not with the Mercy, Love & Clemency that reflectial to Christiania, nor to the Doctrine of Christ, is norto the Liberty the Golfed ealerth all men nato, to whom it is preached. And to have South and Biddies of mon for Money, to enllave them and their Posterity to the end of the World, we jurge is a great hinderance to the spreading of the Gussel, and is occasion of much War, Violence, Cruelty and Oppression, and Thes: & Robery of the highest Nature; for commonly the Negroes that are fold to white Men, are either Hollen away or robbed from their Kindred, and to buy such is the way to continue these evil Practices of Man-stealing, and transgresseth that Golden Rule and Law, To be others what we would have others do to us.

I heretore, in true Christian Love, we earnestly recommend it to all our Friends and Brethren, Not so buy any Negroes, unless it were on purpose to set them see, and that such a ho have bought any, and have them appealent, after some reasonable time of moderate Service they have had of them, or may have of them, that may reasonably answer to the snarge of what they have laid out, especially in thesping blogues.

House, when under Age, that after a realonable time of fervice to answer that Charge, they may let them at Liberty, and during the time they have them, to teach them to read, and give them a Christian Education.

Some Rinfons and Canter of our being against heeping of Nigran

First, Because it is contrary to the Principles and Iraclical the Chassian Quakers to buy Prize or stollen Goods, which we have a faithful Testimony against in our Native Country; and therefore it is our Dury to come forth in a Testimony against stollen Slaves, it being accounted a far greater Crime under Moser's Law than the stealing of Goods; for sinch were only to restore tour fold, but he that stealing of Goods; for sinch were only to restore tour fold, but he that stealeth a kin and fall the king of he be found in his hand, he shall surely be put to David, Exed. 21. 16. Therefore as we are not to buy stollen Good (but if at unawares it should happen through Ignorance, we are to restore them to the Owners, and seek our Remiedy of the Thief) no more are we to buy stollen Slaves; neither should such as have them keep them and their Posterity in perpenual Bondage and Slavery, as is usually done, to the great leandal of the Christian Prosession.

Seconally, Because Christ commanded, saying, All things whatsever so would that men should do unto you, do ye even so to them. Therefore as we and our Children would not be kept in perpetual Bondage and Slavery against our Consent. Slavery against their Consent, it being such intollerable funishment to their Bodies and Minds, that none but note.

 tions Criminal Offendors de sive the line. Set these have done us no harme; therefore how inhumans is it in us so g woully to oppress them and their Children from one Generalism canother.

Thirdly, Because the Lord hath commanded, saying, Then but not delives unto his Master the Servant that is escaped from in Master unto thee, be still duel with thee, even amongs you in that place which he fall chase in one of the Gates, where it likesh best wiff; then shalt not oppress him. Deut. 23. 15, 16. By waich it appeareth, that thole which are at Liberty and freed from their Bondage, should not by us be delivered into Bondage again, neither by us shauld they be oppressed, but being elcaped from his Master, should have the liberty to dwell amongst us, where it liketh him best. Therefore, if God extend such Mercy under the legal Ministration and Dispenfation to poor Servants, he doth and will extend much more of his Grace and Mercy to them under the clear Gospel Ministration; so that instead of punishing them and their Pusterity with cruel Bondage and perpetual Slavery, he will cause the Evertailing Gospel to be preached effectually to all Nations, tothem as well as others; And the Lord will extend Peace to in People like a River, and the Glory of the Gentiles like s faring Stream; And it shall come to pass, saith she Lord, that I will gather all Nations and Tongues, and they shall come and see my Geory, and I will set a fin among them, and I will send these that escape of them unto the Nations, to Farshish, Pull and Lud that draw the Bon to Tuball and Juvan, to the Illes afar of that have not beard my Fame, neither have seen my Glory, und they shall declare my Glo y among the Gentiles, 18a. 66. 12.18.

Fourthly, Because the Lord hath commanded, saying, That

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han not espress an bered Servant that is nour end needy, whether be be of thy Bresbren, or of the Brangers that are its thy Lane within the Gates, leaft be cry against thee auto the Lord, and it be in unto thee; Thou full neither wex a stranger sor oppress him, for ye were strangers in the Land of Ægypt, Dent. 24. 14, 15. Exed. 12. 21. But What greater Oppiession can there be inflicted upon our Follow Creatures, than is inflicted on the poor Negroes! they being brought from their own Country against their Wills, some of them being stollen, others taken for payment of Debt owing by their Parents, and others taken Captive in War, and fold to Merchants, who bring them to the American Plantations, and sell them for Bond-Slaves to them that will give most for them; the Husband from the Wife, and the Children from the Parents; and many that buy them do exceedingly affick them and oppress them, act only by continual hard Labour, but by cruel Whippings, and other cruel Punishments, and by short allowance of Food, some Planters in Ba badoes and Jamaies, 'tis saic's keeping one hundred of them, and some more, and some less, and giving them hardly anything more than they raise on a little piece oi Ground appointed them, on which they work for themselves the seventh dayes of the Week in the after-noon, and on the sirst days, to raise their own Provilions, to wit, Corn and Potatoes, and other Roots, &c. the remainder of their time being spent in their Masters service; which doubtless is far worse usage than is practise... by the Turks and Moors upon their Slaves. Which tends to the great Reproach of the Christian Profission; therefore it would be better sor all such as sall short of the Practice of those Insidels, to resule the Name of a Christian, that those Heathen and Insidels may not be provoked to blaspheme against the biessed Name of Christ, by reason of the unparailes is Crucky

Cracky of these crues and hard bearted pretended. Company Surely the Lord doin behald their Oppressions & Assictions, and will further visit for the same by his righterus and just Judgments, except they break off their sins by Repentance, and their Iniquity by shewing Mercy to these poor afficiend, ormanical milerable shaves!
