A Proclamation for a publike, generall, and solemne Fast.



HeKingsmost Excellent Maiestie, vpon the humble Petition of the Lords Spirituall and Temporall, and Commons in the present Parliament allembled, taking into his Princely confideration the many important caules, and extraordinary occations calling byon him, and his people for a toynt and generall humiliation of all Estates of his Lingdome, befoze Almighty God in Prayer and Falling, aswell for anerting this heavy Thutation of Plague and Pelilence, already bes gun, and dangeroully dispersed in many parts of this Kingdome, as also for drawing downehis Blessing bpon his Maielly and his people, and Armies both by Sea and Land, hath therefore (according to the Royalland laudable example of other godly Kings) by the aduice and

affifiance of his Prelates and Bilhops, cauled an Deder of Direction for publique Prayer and Falting, to beconceined and published in Print, in a Booke for this speciall purpose, to be generally observed and solemnized, in humble hope and confidence, that when both Prince and People together through the whole Land, Chalioyne in one common, & Colemne Deuotion, of lending bp their faithfull and repentant Prayers to Almighty God at one instant of time, the same shall bee moze anaileable to oblame that mercie, helpe and comfort from him, which in the prefent impor

tant occasions this Church and Common-wealth doe stand in neede of.

his Batelie doeth therefore by this prefent Proclamation fraitly charge and command, That a generall, publike, and folenme fast be kept and holden, as well by abstimence from food, as by publike Prayers, Preaching, and hearing of the word of God, and other facred duties, according to the direction of the faid Booke, in all collegiate and parilly Churches and Chappels Within this Kingdome of England, and Dominion of Wales, bpon wednelday, the twentieth day of this infrant moneth of July, and from thencefoorth continued bpon the wednesday of every weeke following, by the reverend, religious, and devout Allembly of the whole Congregation of fuch of the Inhabitants in each leuerall place, as are free and late from danger of Infection, and may in euery Family be conveniently spared; willing and requiring, alwell all Archbillops, and Bis thops, in their fenerall Provinces, and Diocesses, and all Parlons, Cicars and Eurats, within their severall Partihes and Charges, as also all Paiors, Sheristes, Justices of Peace, and other Officers in their feverall places, limits, and inviductions, respectively to take especial care, that this his Paielies Royall commandement be duly executed and observed : And that they themfelues be lights of good example to the reft; And that all others in manner aforefaid, doe biligent. ly and denoutly follow and performe the fame, as they tender their duties to Almighty God, and to their Prince and Countrey, and will answere for their prophane, or contemptuous neglect hereof at their bitermost perils.
