A PROCLAMATION

For a general THANKSGIVING:

LIBOUGH Almighty GOD hath given us many extraordinary Occasions to bless His holy Name, and very lately hath filled our Mouths with Joy and Thanksgiving for the entire Reduction of Ganada; yet we ought not to be unmindful of His ordinary Bleilings, nor, whilft we are praising Him for our Deliverance in War, forget that to Him we owe the daily Bread which we eat in Peace: And, as this is the proper Scafon to glorify Him who vibiteth the Earth and bleffed, it, and crowneth the Year with His Goodness, let Us at the same Time that we thank Him for having plentifully supplied us with the Necessaries of Life, praise Him also for --- that He both fecured to us the Enjoyment of these Bieflings, by preserving to us under his Majesty's mild Government, or Igeneral Liberties, as well religious as civil; that He bath preserved the Life of our most gracious King, and by a Series of Successes, prospered his Endeavours to maintain the Rights of his People, and the Protestant Religion against an unnatural Combination, dang rous to both; and, that He hath inspired his Majesty's Councellurs with Wildom and Unanimity, his Commanders and Forces with Prudence and Valour, and his People with Levalty and Obedience; whereby He, who worketh His Wonders by natural Means, hath done fuch great Things The last search Number 1 have thought fit to appoint, and I do by and with the Advice of His Majeffy's Council . ppoint, Thursday the Twenty-seventh Day of this Instant November to be a Day of general THANKSGIVING, in order transfully to commemorate, according to the laudable Practice of this Government, the Mercies of the preecceling Year. And I recommend to all Minitlers of the Gospel within this Province, with their several Congregations, that they meet on the faid Day, and in a public and folemn Manner return Thanks to Almighty GOD for . Il His Bleffings conferred upon us, and particularly for the Mercies beforementioned; and humbly to befeech Him, that, notwithflanding our Unworthiness, He would be graciously pleased to continue His Providence over us. And I command and enjoin all Magistrates and Civil Officers to see that the said Day be observed as a Day set apart for religious Duties, and that no fervile Labour be permitted on the fame.

GIVEN at Boston, the Seventh Day of November 1760, in the Thirty-fourth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
