Proclamation.

HEREAS the United States in Congress affembled, taking into their Confideration the many Inflances of divine Goodness to these States, in the Course of the important Conslict in which they have been to long engaged; the prefent happy and promiting State of public Affairs, and the Events of the War in the Course of the Year, now drawing to a Close, particularly the Harmony of the public Councils, which is so necesfary to the Success of the public Cause; the perfect Union and good Understanding which has hitherto subsisted between them and their Allies, notwithstanding the artful and unwearied Attempts of the common Enemy to divide them; the Success of the Arms of the United States and those of their Allies; and the Acknowledgement of their Independence by another European Power, whose Friendship and Commerce must be of great and lasting Advantage to these States, have, by their Act of the eleventh Day of October Instant, recommended to the feveral States, to interpose their Authority in appointing and commanding the Observation of Thursday the twenty-eighth Day of November next as a Day of folemn Thankfgiving: I DO therefore, as well in Regard to the faid Recommendation of Congress, as in pursuance of a Resolution of the General Assembly of the faid State, hereby appoint and proclaim, that Thursday the twenty-eighth Day of November next, be observed throughout this State as a Day of solema Thankfgiving to GOD for all his Mercies: And I do earneftly recommend to the Inhabitants of the faid State, to abstain on that Day from servile Labour and all Recreations unsuitable to the Purpose of such Solemnity, and attend Places of public Worship; and that all Ranks testify their Gratitude to GOD for his Goodness by a cheerful Obedience to his Laws; and by promoting each in his Station and by his Influence, the Practice of true and undefiled Keligion, which is the great Foundation of public Prosperity and national Happiness.
