Have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Council, to appoint Thursday the Sixteenth Day of November next to be observed as a Day of public Thanksgiving throughout the Province. And I recommend to the Religious Societies of every Denomination to offer up their devout Praises to our most bountiful Benefactor for these and all other his Mercies conferred upon us; and to accompany their Praises with servent Prayers that we may evidence the Gratitude of our Hearts by the Obedience of our Lives, and may so order our Conversation aright as to see the surther Salvation of GOD.

AND all servile Labour is forbidden on the said Day.

Given at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Twenty-third Day of October, 1769, in the Ninth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
