## FOURTH OF JULY, 1819.

Arrangements adopted by the Committees of the Corporation & Military Association.

1. The day to be announced by a Gun at day-break.

2. At sun-rise a salute of 13 guns, in honor of the old Confederation—the bells of the several Churches to ring during the firing.

3. At 9 o'clock A. M. the Citizens, &c. to assemble at the Mansion House.

4. At 10 o'clock A. M. the procession to be formed on the firing of a signal gun, and move through Market, Columbia, Pearl, Hudson and Green streets to the Baptist Church, in the following order:

Marshal of the day—Col. Stilwell.

Assistant Marshals—Capt. Jenkins and Capt. Cole.

Maj. Dalaby's corps of U. S. troops.

Capt. Campbell's Artillery.

Capt. Judson's Infantry.

Capt. Williams's Governor's Guards.

Officers of the Revolutionary Army and Members of the Society of Cincinnati.
