## A Freclamation for a publick FAST.

PON due Consideration of the sovereign and universal Providence of Almighty GOD, and that all the Assairs and Interests of his People are under the Influence of his gracious and invision Conduct and that it is their Duty & Privilege, by Prayer and Supplication, with I hanksgiving, to make known their Requests to Him, who is a GOD that heareth Prayer, and to whom all Flesh shall come;

Dave thought lit, with the Advice of his Maisliv's Council, to other and appoint Thurklay the Twenty-seventh Day of March next, to be observed as a Day of Fasting and Prayer throughout this province; hereby exhorting both Ministers and People in their publick Assemblies and private Devotions religiously to solemnize the same, by humbling themselves under the mighty hand of ODD, and the manifest Tokens of his Displeasure against this People, and by sincere and penitent Confession of the many and aggravated Sins which have justly provoked him; and by earnest and humble Supplications for removing his righteous Judgments infliced on us, and prebenting those that are impending over us, as also for bestowing on us all necessary 13 lestings, spiritual and temporal: And in particular, That it would please GOD to bless our Sovereign Lord the KING, with his Royal Confort our most gracious QUEEN, his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Duke, and the rest of the Royal Osspring, and the other Branches of the Royal Family; That he Would give Succels to his Pajelty's Councils for maintaining Peace Within the Kingdoms and Dominions under his happy Covernment, and reftoring it to the States and Kingdoms in Europe now embroiled in War; That GDD would please to direct and prosper the Administration of the Covernment Within this Province, and continue to us the Enjoyment of our invaluable Privileges religious and civil; That he would mercifully remember us in the Occasions of the Epring and Summer ensuing, and command his Bledling on our Husbandry. Werchandize and Kilhery, and prosper the Works of our hands; That he would maintain peace in our Boiders and health in our habitations; And above all, That he would grant the gracious Influences of his holy Spirit to all Debers of Wen among us, that so we may reform whatever is aintis, and find Grace and favour in his light, and be prepared for a thankful Reception of these all other needful Blellings; and that the Bingdom of our Lord and Daviour JESUS CHRIST may come with great Power and Blory: And all service Labour and Recreations are prohibited on the said Day.

Given at the Council Chamber in Boston, the Twenty-fifth Day of February 1734, And in the Eighth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
