A PROCLAMATION

For a Day of public Humiliation, Fasting and Prayer.

To being at all Times our indispensable Duty, as a People, devoutly to acknowledge the superintending Providence of GOD, especially in Times of public Calamity, to humble ourselves before Him, penitently confessing our Sins, and imploring His gracious Interposition for our Deliverance. And whereas the Congress have recommended to the several States that Wednesday the Twenty-sixth Day of April Instant should be set apart and observed as a Day of Fasting, Humiliation and Prayer:

WE have thought fit, with the Advice of the Council, to appoint, and do hereby appoint WEDNESPAY the Twenty-fixth Day of April Inft. to be a Day of Fasting, Humiliatics and Prayer, throughout this State; calling upon Ministers and People of alDenominations, with one Heart and one Voice, to implore the Sovereign Lord & Heaven and Earth, to remember Mercy in His Judgments ;-- to make us finceely penitent for our Transgrellions ;-- to prepare us for Deliverance, and to renove the Evils with which He hath been pleased to visit us ;--to banish Vice and Irreligion from among us, and establish Virtue and Piety by His Divine Grace;--to bless all public Councils throughout the Unied States, giving them Wisdm, Firmness and Unanimity, and directing them to the best Measures for thepublic Good;—to bless the Magistrates and People of every Rank, and animae and unite the Hearts of all to promote the Interests of their Country; - to bles the public Defence; inspiring all Commanders and Soldiers with Magninim y and Perseverance, and giving Vigor and Success to the Military Operationsby Sea and Land;—to bless the illustrious Sovereign and the Nation in Alliane with these States, and all who interest themselves in the Support of our Right and Liberties; to make that Alliance of perpetual and extensive Usefulness to hose immediately concerned, and wankind in general ;--to grant fruitful Scasons, and to bless our Industry, Trade and Manufactures; -- to bless all Schools and Seminaries of Learning, and every Means of Instruction and Education ;--- to cause Wars to cease, and to establish Peace among the Nations.

And all servile Labour and Recreation are forbidden on said Day.
