A PROCLAMATION

FOR A DAY OF PUBLIC

FASTING, HUMILIATION, AND PRAYER.

The season is approaching when our fathers were accustomed to implore the Divine forgiveness for their sins, and to seek the blessing of Heaven upon the opening year.

I do, therefore, by and with the advice and consent of the Council, appoint THURSDAY, THE TENTH DAY OF APRIL NEXT, to be observed by the people of this Commonwealth as a day of FASTING, HUMILIATION, AND PRAYER.

And I earnestly invite the people of the Commonwealth to abstain from all amusements and unnecessary labor:— To assemble in their respective places of religious worship:

To consider in the spirit of Christianity the private and public sins of this community:

To invoke the blessing of Heaven upon all useful pursuits,—upon the poor, the afflicted, and the oppressed,—and upon all institutions of education, charity, and religion:

To contemplate the value of their civil and religious privileges:

And, finally, to realize the hand of God in the foundation and continued existence of the wonderful system of government under which they live.

Given at the Council Chamber, in Boston, this eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and of the Independence of the United States the seventy-fifth.
