Esolved, nemine contradicente, by the Lords Spiritual, and Temporal, and Commons in Parliament assembled: That they do declare, that they are fully fatisfied by the proofs they have heard, that there now is, and for divers years last past hath been a Horrid, and Treasonable Plot, and Conspiracy, contrived, and carried on by those of the Popish Religion, for the Murdering of his Malesties sacred Person, and for subverting the Protestant Religion, and the ancient, and cstablished Government of this Kingdom.

Instead of Venite, Exultemus, shall this Pfalm following be used; one Verse by the Minister, and another by the Clerk and People.

They encourage themselves in mischief: and pal, Lxiv. s. commune among themselves, how they may lay maves, and fay, that no man hall feethem.

Pfal. LXXIX-9 Help us, O God of our falvation, for the glory of thy Name: O deliver us, and be merciful unto our fins for thy Names fake.

For thou, Lord, art good and gracious: and Pfal, LXXXVI. of great mercy unto all them that call upon thee.

Behold, God is my helper: the Lord is with them. Pfal. LIV. 4. that uphold my foul.

Pfal.LXXXVI.17. Shew some token upon me for good, that they who bate me may fee it and be assamed : because thou, Lord, half holpen me and comforted me.

Thou shalt grant the King a long life: that his years Pfal. LXI. o. may endure throughout all generations,

be thall dwell before Fon for ever: Oprepare thy loving mercy and faithfulness, that they may vielerve him.

Instead of the Collect for the Day, shall be used this, which followeth, both in Morning, and Evening Prayer, and in the Communion-Service.

Liniality God, who of thy great Hercy toward A us half discovered the Deligns, and disappointed the Attempts of those Populy Configurators, who under the pretence of Religion, and the most Dory Mame, had contribe our Destruction, and labour oby the most unjuditiable Wethods of Treason, and Wurther, and the Affalination of Dis Pajeffies Sacred Perlan, to introduce the Tyzanny of a foreign power, and the Abomination of Superlittous (Morthip, and thereby to endave both the bodies and fouls of thy fervants, and to ertinauith the bleffed light of thy holy Golpel amongst us: Cale yield thee praffe, and thanks for this thine infinite goodness to us; imploying the Grace and favour in the farther Discovery of these depths of Satan, this mustery of iniquity. Sond forth thy Light, and thy Truth, and let them prefer ve us. Proteat, and defend our Sovereign Lord the King. Bind up his foul in the bundle of life, and let no Weapon form'd against him prosper. Cloth all his enemies with chame; but upon Dimfelf, and Dis Posterity let the Crown ever dourish. To this end Bleis the present Parliament now Assembled, and knit together the Dearts of this whole Pacton, as the heart of one mian, in the defence of our King, our Laws, and our Religion. Teach us to know, at least in this our Day, the things which belong to our peace, and let them not be his from our Eyes. Remove from among us the Accurred Ching; those personal, and those publick Builts, the cry whereof is none up to Deaven, and calls aloud for Aengeance. And grant, that being by true repentance reconcil's to thee our God, we may also be united by Thistian Love, and Tharify to one another: So that we welking in the paths of the holy Law

Lmighty God, who half in all ages thewed the A Power and Hercy in the miraculous and gracious deliverances of the Church, and in the Protection of righteous and religious kings and States, professing thy holy and eternal Truth, from the wicker Conspiracies, and malicious practices of all the enemies thereof; Be thou fill our mighty Protector, and featter our enemies that delight in Bloud: Infatuate and defeat their Counfels, abate their Price, af swage their Walice, and confound their Devices: Strengthen the hands of our gracious King CHARLES, and all that are put in Authority under him, with Audament and Justice, to cut off all fuch workers of Iniquity, as turn Religion into Rebellion, and Faith into Faction; that they may never prevail against us, of triumph in the raine of thy Thurch among us: But that our gracious Sovereign and his Realms being preferved in thy true Religion, and by thy merciful gwonels protected in the fame, we may all only ferve thee, and give thee thanks in thy holy Congregation, through Jelus Chiff our Lord. Immediately after the Prayer For the whole state of Christs Church, shall this be used.

When thou threwest us into horrid Confusions, from which we taw then little hope of ariting; even in the time of that diffress did we trespass pet more against thee. When by Miracles of Wercy thou hadd turn'd our Captivities; we foon return'd to Folly, to our bomit, and to our wallowing in our former, or greater filthinefo. Even while thou half of late appear'd forus, by discovering the Plots and Contrivances of our implacable Chemies of the Romin Faction, we have been in the mean time by our fins fighting against locaven, and against thee. And now we are no more worthy to be called either thy fong, or thy fervants; whom neither thy Fear both driven, nor thy Goodness led to Repentance. In Dercy awaken our drowtie Consciences. Soften, and subvue our bard bearts into deep contrition. Pardon the many great offences of usthy ferhants, and the crying fing of the whole Mation. Remove the Evils we now lie under. Abert the Turnmenta.
