A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS the Most Honorable the Continental Congress did, on the Sixteenth Day of March last, mide and pulse the following Resolve, to wit:

"In Times of impending Calamity and Distress, when the Liberties of America are imminently endangered by the Secret Machinations and open Affaults of an insidious and vindustive Administration, it becomes the indispensible Duty of these theorems there and happy Colonies, with true Penitence of Heart, and the most reverent Devotion, publicly to acknowledge the over-rad

thereto tree and happy Colonies, with true Penitence of Heart, and the most reverent Devotion, publicly to acknowledge the over-ruling Providence of God; to confess and deplore our Offences against him; and to supplicate his Interposition for averting the attreatened Danger, and prospering our strenuous Efforts in the Cause of Freedom, Virtue and Posterior.

The Congress therefore, considering the warlike Preparations of the Bilish Ministry to subvert our valuable Rights and Privileges, and to reduce us, by Fire and Sword, by the Savages of the Wilderness, and our own Domestics, to the most abject and ignominious Bondage: Defirous, at the same Time, to have People of all Ranks and Degrees duly impressed with a solemn Sense of God's superintending Providence, and of their Duty, devoutly to rely in all their lawful Enterprizes on his Aid and Direction—do garnestly recommend that Friday the Seventeenth Day of Asy next be observed by the faid Colonies as a Day of Flumination, Fasting and Prayer, that we may with united Hearts confess and bewail our manifold Sins and Transgressions, and by a sincere Repentance and Amendment of Life appeals his righteous Displeasure, and through the Merits and Mediation of Jesus Christ, obtain his Pardon and Forgiveness: Humbly imploring his Aisstance to frustrate the cruel Purposes of our unnatural Enemies; and by inclining their Hearts to Justice and Benevolence, prevent the farther Essuado his didens. But if continuing deaf to the Voice of Reason and Humanity, and inflexibly bent on Desolation and War, they constrain us to repel their hostile Invasions by opea to guard and protect them in the Day of Battle, and to crown the Continental Arms by Sea and Land with Victory and Success: Earnessly beseeching him to bless our Civil Rulers, and the Representatives of the People, in their several Assemblies and Conventions; to preserve and strengthen their Union; to inspire them with an ardent disinterested Love of their Country, to give Wildom and Stability to their Councils; and direct them to the most essential Related to bless all the People in the Colonies with Health and Plenty, and grans that a Spirit of incorruptible Patriotism and of pure undefiled Religion may universally prevail; and this Continent be specially restored to the Blessings of Peace and Liberty, and enabled to transmit them inviolate to the latest Posterity. And whereas the Honorable the General Affembly of the Colony aforesaid, at their Session held at Previdence on the First Wednesses in May inst. did make and pass an Ast adopting the afore-recited Resolve, and therein appointed the said Seventeenth Day of May to be observed in and throughout the said Colony as a Day of Humiliation, Fasting and Prayer, forbad all service Labour on that Day, and requested me to issue a Proclamation-accordingly: I have therefore thought sit to issue this Proclamation, to declare and make known the same, and do hereby earnessly call upon the Inhabitants of the said Colony to assemble for public Worship on the said Seventeenth Day of May, agreeable to the said Resolution: And all service Labour is forbidden on that Day.

GIVEN under my Hand, and the Seal of the faid Colony, at Providence, this Sixth Day of May; in the Year of our LORD One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-jax.
