

## Hythe King.

## A Proclamation for a generall Fast to be kept thorowout the Realm of England.

He Kings most Excellent Majestie, observing the correcting hand of God upon the Kingdom in many years Petitience, the present interruptions of that long continued blessing of Peace, and other lignes of his anger for the lins of the Land; and seriously considering the weighty assures of State now in agitation in the high Court of Parliament, out of His truly Religious heart to God, and His tender care of His Kingsdom and peoples weisare (according to the practice of pious Kings and Princes in some ages, in times of common calamities, which concern both Prince and people) hath resolved (with the humble addite of the

Loids and Commons now allembled in Parliament) by a folemn and publike Falt, in the first place to have recourse to the Divine Pajestie, to imploze his mercy and fabour to him and his people, as well for removing the present Judgements, as for a blessing upon the great Affairs and bulinesses in hand concerning his Pajestie and the Pub-And therefore his Pajellie doth hereby fraitly charge and command that a generall and publike Falt be kept and holden, as well by ablinence from Food, as by publike Prayers and hearing the wood of God, and other facred Duties, in all Cathediall, Collegiate, and Parish Churches and Chappels within the City of London, the Suburbs thereof, and the ade joyning parithes of Saint Clement Danes, Saint Giles in the fields, Saint James at Clarkenwell, Saint Katharine Tower, Saint Leonard Shoreditch, Saint Martins in the fields, Saint Mary Whitechappell, Saint Magdalene Bermond, and Savoy Parilly, upon Tuclday the sebenteenth day of this infant Robember: And mall other Cathedrall, Collegiate, and Pariff Churches and Chappels within the Kingdom of England, and Dominion of Wales, upon Tucloay the eighth day of Des cember next enfuing the date hereof: All which his Pajefie doth expellely charge and command that be Reverendly and Deboutly performed by all his lobing Subjects, as they tender the favour of Almighty God, and would aboid his just indignation against this Land, and upon pain of such pumidments as his Pajelly may jufly inflict upon all such as thall contemn of neglect to religious a work.

Given at the Court at Whitehall the eleventh day of November in the fixteenth yeer of His Majesties Reign.
