derfully preferbed and bleffed Their Pajeffies hitherto, and this Kingdom by Their means) That he will bouchfafe a special Bleffing to this their Rightrous Andertaking, Do, by and with the Advice of their Privy Council, hereby Appoint and Command a General and Publick Fast and Humiliation to be observed throughout this Kingdom, That so both Their Pajesties and Their Subjects may humble Themselves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon for Their Sins, and may in most devout and solemn manner send up Their Pajesties Arms, and for Restoring and Perpetuating Peace, Safety, honour, and Prospective to all Their Pajesties Arms, and so Restoring and Derived Publish and Declare to all Their Loving Huberts, and destrict Kingdoms and Command, That on Aconesday being the Fifth day of June nert ensuing, this Fast be Religiously and Solemnly kept and observed within the Cities of London and Westmidser, and within Ten miles distance of the same: And that on Acone and westmidser, and within Ten miles distance of the same: And that on Acone of the Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed. Given at Our Court at Hampton-Court, this 23th Day of May, 1689. In the First Year of Our Reign.
