

By the King and Queen, A PROCLAMATION For a General FAST.

Heir Pajesties taking into most serious Consideration the great War, in Which Their Pajesties (together With most of the Princes and States of Europe) are engaged, against the French King; And that upon the Success thereof the common Safety of this Realm both, under God, Wholly depend; And putting Their Trust in Almighty God, that he will bouchsafe a special Blessing on Their Pajesties Righteous Undertaking, and thereby consumerate the Deliverance of these Kingdoms: have thought sit to Appoint, and do, by and with the Advice of Their Privy Council, hereby Appoint and Command a General and Publick Hast and Humiliation, to be Observed throughout this Realm of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, in most Debout and Solemn manner, so Supplicating Almighty God

for Pardon of our Sins, and Imploring his Blessing and Protection in the Preservation of Their Paselies Sacred Persons, and Prosperity of Their Arms both at Land and Sea, to be Religiously Kept and Observed on Wednesday the Pine and twentieth Day of this Instant April, and from thencesorth on the Thitd Wednesday of every Ponth during the present Wax. And so, the more orderly Solemnizing of the said several Fall-Days, Their Waselties have given Directions to the Right Reverend the Bishops of this Kingdom to Compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be Aled in all Churches and Chappels, and other Places of Publick Tooship; And have given Charge so, the Dispersing thereof through their several Diocesses in the Whole Kingdom. And Their Paselties do most express Charge and Command, That the said Fastings and Prayers be Soberly, Reverently and Decently Personned by all Their Loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon pain of such Punishments, as Their Paselties can justly Institution all such as hall Contemn or Regien to Religious a Mojek.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall, the Ninth Day of April, 1691. In the Third Year of Our Reign.
