And Their Pajesties do most expessly Charge and Command, That the said Katings and Prayers be Soverly, Reverently and Decently Personned by all Their Loving Subjects, as they tender the Kadour of Almighty God, and upon pain of such punishments, as Their Pajesties can justly Institute upon all such as shall Contenn or Reglet so Religious a Mork. gled to Religious a Work.
