

## By the Lords Justices, A PROCLAMATION For a General FAST.

E taking into Dur molt Serious Consideration the Continued War, in which his Pajethy (Dur gracious Sobereign) together with most of the Princes and States of Europe are Engaged against the French King, and that upon the Success thereof the Common Safety of his Pajethes Kingdom doth, under Bod, wholly depend: And putting Dur trust in Almighty God, that he will Clouchsafe a Special Blessing on his Pajethies Kighteous Andertakings, and Consummate the Deliberance of these Pations, by Settling the same in a firm and lating State of Peace, Security, and Pajespeity; Habe thought sit to Appoint, and do by Council) hereby Appoint and Command a General and Publick Fast and Rumissiation, to be Observed thoughtup this Pajethis.

Council) hereby Appoint and Command a General and Publick fact, and humiliation, to be Observed throughout his Pairlies Realm of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, in most Orbout and Solemn Pamer, for Supplicating Almighty God for the Pardon of Dur Sins, and for Imploying his Blessing and Protection in the Preservation of his Pairlies Sacred Person, and Prosperity of his Arms both at Land and Sea, on Wednesday the Pineteinth Day of June. And for the more orderly Solemnizing of the same, the have given Directions to the Right Reverend the Bishops of this Kingdom to Compose a form of Prayer luitable to this Occasion, to be Ased in all Churches and Chappels, and other Places of Publick Monthly; And to take Care for the timely Dispersing of the same through their laberal Dioceses in the Whole Bingdom. And the do Arithly Charge and Command, That the said Fastings and Prayers be Solvety, Reverently and Decently Personned by all his Passesies Lobing Subjects, as they tender the Fabour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of such Punishments, as his Paicsty can suffly Institute upon all such as shall Contemn or Pegica so Religious a Mosk.

Given at the Council Chamber at Whitehall the Three and twentieth Day of May, 1695. In the Seventh Year of His Majesties Reign.
