A PROCLAMATION.



in continuing the Calamities of War—the Reasons there are to be still prolonged, and surther extended—The Displeasure of G and manneited against our sinful Land, the Year past, in a very severe and distressing Drought, whereby the Fruits of the Earth have been greatly cut short.—The lamentable Implety and Irreligion prevailing among us, and that under the most affecting Series of Judgments and Mercies; all which are loud Calls to the deepest Humiliation and Repentance.

HAVE thought fit, with Advice of the Council, and Defire of the Representatives, in General Court affembled, to appoint, and I do hereby appoint, Wednesday, the Seventh Day of April next, to be observed throughout this Colony, as a Day of solemn Fasting and Prayer; earnestly exhorting all his Majesty's Subjects, Ministers and People, within this Colony, to a religious Observance of the fame; deeply humbling themselves under the Judgments of God, for all the Impiety, Profanation of God's holy Name, Sabbaths and Ordinances; Neglects of Gospel Grace, Incorrigibleness and Ingratitude; the Unrighteousness, Intemperance, Uncleanness, and all other Kinds of Iniquity abounding among us; and that they fincerely turn from all their Sins, unto Gop, thro' Christ, by deep Repentance, and thorough Reformation. And that they likewise offer up most fervant Prayers to the GOD of all Grace, for his Sacred Majesty King George the Third, our Gracious Queen CHARLOTTE, her Royal Highness, the Princess Dowager of Wales, and all the Royal Family. That God would graciously direct the King's Council, bless his Administration of Government, succeed his Negotiations, abundantly prosper his Arms, and those of his Allies; prevent any further spreading of the War, speedily grant a ravourable Issue of it, by the Establishment of a just, advantageous and lasting Peace, by the fecuring of the Protestant Interest, and great Enlargement of the REDEEMER's Kingdom on Earth; and direct all the important Affairs of the Nation in much Mercy. That God would ever graciourly regard our Land, and this Colony in particular; blefs us in our Rulers; preferve to us all our Liberties and Privileges; direct and succeed the Agency of the Colony, at the Court of Great Britain, and preserve our Soldiery. That God would abundantly pour out his Spirit upon us, in this Time of great Security and growing Iniquity; fucceed the Gospel Ministry; heal all our Divisions, by removing the Causes of them, uniting the Hearts of all his People in Truth and Love; bless the College, and other Schools of Learning; fmile on his People in all their fecular Interests; continue to us the great Blessing of Health; bring forward the springing of the Year, crown it with abundant Manifestations of His Goodness, and give us thankful, obedient Hearts, under the Receipt of all Divine Mercies.

And all servile Labour is forbidden on said Day.
