by the secret machinations and open assaults of an insidious and vindictive Administration, is becomes the indispensible duty of these hitherto free and happy Colonies, with true penitence of heart, and the most reverent devotion, publickly to acknowledge the over ruling providence of God; to confess and deplore our offences against him; and to supplicate his interposition for averting the threatened danger, and presenting our strenuous efforts in the cause of Freedom, Virtue and Posterier.

THE CONGRESS therefore, considering the warlike preparations of the British Ministry to subvert our in-Valuable rights and privileges, and to reduce us by fire and sword, by the savages of the wilderness and our own dometics, to the most abject and ignominious bondage: Desirous, at the same time, to have people of all tanks and degrees, duly impressed with a solemn Tense of God's superintending providence, and of their ducy devoutly to rely in all their lawful enterprizes on his aid and direction—do earnestly recommend, that FRIDAY, the seventeenth day of May next, be observed by the said Colonies as a day of HUMI-LIATION, FASTING, and PRAYER; that we may with united hearts confess and bewail our manifold fins and transgressions, and by a sincere repentance and amendment of life, appeale his righteous displeasure. and through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ, obtain his pardon and forgiveness; humbly imploring his assistance to frustrate the cruel purposes of our unnasural enemies; and by inclining their hearts to justice and benevolence, prevent the further effusion of kindred blood. But if continuing deaf to the voice of reason and humanity, and inflexibly bent on desolation and war, they constrain to repel their hossile invalions by open relistance, that it may please the Lord of Hosts, the God of Armies, be animate our Officers and Soldiers with invincible fortitude, to guard and proceed them in the day of bartle, and to crown the Continental arms by sea and land with victory and success: Earnestly beseeching him so bless our eivil Rulers and the Representatives of the People in their several Assemblies and Conventions; to sieferte and firengthen their Union, to inspire them with an ardent difinterested love of their Country; so give wildom and stability to their Councils; and direct them to the most efficacious measures for estabilling the Rights of America on the most honorable and permanent basis—that he would be graciously pleased to bies all his People in these Colonies with Health and Plenty, and grant that a spirit of incorruptible Pacificallia and of pure undefiled Religion may univerfally prevail; and this Continent be speedily restosed to she blessings of Peace and Liberty, and enabled to transmit them inviolate to the latest Posterity; And it is recommended to Christians of all denominations to assemble for Public Worlhip, and abstain from By Order of Congress, fervile Labour on the faid Dir.
