## A PROCLAMATION:

LTHOUGH we bove abandant reason gratefully to adore the Divine frances, for the degree of plenty, the general bealth and tranquility, and many other blessings which the People of this State have enjoyed in the year past; yet we ought with humble Reverence, to motice the Dispensations of Divine Providence, in permitting devouring Insects to destroy the fruits of the Earth, and disappoint the bopes of the Hashandman in many places, in the last, and some preceding years, and other tokens of the righteous displassure of Amighty GOD: And considering the prevalence of Vice, the profonation of the Sabbath, neglect of the Gospel and means of Grace, and other Immoralities visible in the land:

HAVE thought fit, by and with the advice of Council, to appoint, and do hereby appoint, THURSDAY, the 17th of April next, to be religiously observed as a day of FASTING, HUMILIATION and PRAYER throughout this State, earnestly exhorting Ministers and People of all denominations, to assemble for Divine Service, and with sincere repentance of all their offences, and becoming humility, to implore the forgiveness of all our iniquities and transgressions.

Also, to offer up fervent supplications to Almighty G O D, the Father of Mercies, that he may be graciously pleased to bless these United States; give wisdom, integrity, and sirmness to our Councils; direct and influence their consultations, in such manner as eventually to promote the greatest prosperity and happiness of the Nation: That it may graciously please Him to smile upon and bless the people of this State; inspire them with wisdom, virtue, and a proper sense of the many favours and privileges conferred upon us: That it may please Him to grant us health in all our dwellings, and continue our land a quiet habitation: Bless us in our agriculture, and in all the labour of our hands; grant fruitful seasons; prosper us in our trade, navigation, and sishery; succeed the means of education; continue to us the Gospel and means of Grace, and make us a people of his praise; extend the peaceful influence of the Redeemer's kingdom over all the nations of the earth, and sill the world with his glory.

And all servile labour and recreations, are forbidden on said day.

Given 2t Norwich, the 21st day of March, in the year of our LORD, One thousand, seven bundred and eighty-eight, and in the twelfth year of the Independence of the United States of America.
