A PROCLAMATION For a General FAST.

FROM a Sense of our Dependance upon the Blessing of Heaven for Success in all our Affairs:

HAVE thought fit to appoint, and I do, with the Advice of His Majesty's Council, appoint Thu Iday the Eighteenth Day of April next, to be obferved as a Day of Fafting and Prayer hroughout this Province; recommending to Ministers and People a religious Observance of the said Day, by a penitent Confession of their Sins, and by offering up their fervent Prayers for the obtaining the Divine Favour, both in spiritual and temporal Regards: In an especial Manner—that the I is and Health of our Sovereign Lord King GEORGE may long be continued—that the best of Blessings may descend and rest upon His Sacred Person, and His illustrious Family—that the Administration of His Majesty's Government throughout the British Dominions may be succeeded and prospered—that the Rulers in this Province may be faithful to their Trusts—that the People may lead quiet and peaceable Lives in all Godliness and Honesty-that our civil and religious Liberties may be protected and preserved—that all who seek our Prosperity may prosper—that, in the Course of the present Year, it may please God to bless us in our Husbandry, Merchandize and Fithery, and in all the Works of our Hands—to continue the general Health which of his great Mercy we now enjoy—to prepare us by holy and righteous Lives to receive his most gracious Favours--and to enlarge and extend the Kingdom of our bleffed Saviour throughout the World.

And all fervile Labour and Recreation are forbidden on the faid Day.

GIVE N at the Council Chamber in Boston, the Seventh Day of March, 1771, in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
