A PROCLAMATION for a publick FAST.

PORASMUCH as the present Dispensations and Aspects of Divine Providence towards this People, as well as the common and usual Occasions of the Year (now ensuing) require our publick and solemn Supplications to Almighty GOD, that He would mercifully relieve us under our Troubles and Difficulties, and grant us his Direction and Blessing in all our Affairs and Interests;

Dave thought fit, with the Advice of His Majesty's Council, to appoint Thursday the Twenty-Sixth of March next, to be observed as a Day of Fasting and Prayer throughout this Province; hereby calling both upon Ministers and People to humble themselves under the level to beard of IDD, and with penitent Confession of Sin, earnestly to implose the Divine Sagely to turn albay his Anger from us, and to confer upon us all necessary Blessings; In particular, That it would please COD to stop the Progress of the infectious and mortal Sickness he has sent among us, or that he would thereby correct us with the Tenderness of a Father, that so this grievous Affliction may riced us (especially those who may be more immediately exercised therewith) the peaceable fruits of Rightcousness; That he would riftoze health where it is wanted, and continue it where it is enjoyed; That he would please to maintain Peace on our Bozders and deliber and return the Remainder of our Captives, and graciously succeed all Measures taken by this Covernment for those Burpoles; That he would bless the husbandry of this Land by giving us Rain from Beaven and fruitful Seasons; That he would revibe and prosper our Trade, Navigation and Fishery; That he would graciously direct and succeed the Administration of the Government of this Province, and prolong our invaluable Privileges, Beligious and Civil; That he would continue the Life of our Sovereign Lord the KING, and grant him the best of Bleslings; That he would direct and succeed his Wajesty's Counsels and Administrations for preserving the Beace of Europe, and maintaining the Rights of his Crown, and the Liberties of his Subjects, That he would bless his Royal Dighness the Prince of Wales, the Princess Dowager of Wales. the Duke, and the rest of the Royal Family; and that he would revive the Power of the Christian Religion in all his Hajelty's Dominions, particularly in this Land, that so it may prevail over all Infidelity, Deism, Prophanels, and all Manner of Mickedness and Immorality; And that the Unowledge of our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST may fil the whole Earth as the Waters cover the Sea. And all fervile Labour and Recreations are foldidden on the said Day.

Given at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Twenty-fifth Day of February 1752, in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
