A PROCLAMATION for a general FAST.

T being our indiffensible Duty, by Prayer and Supplication, to acknowledge our Dependence on Almighty GOD, and to seek unto Him for all necessary Blessings; and particularly, in a more publick and solemn Manner, to implore the Divine Favour upon all the Concerns and Interests of our Nation and Land; And the Season of the Year now approaching, wherein our Affairs do more immediately require our united Supplications for Direction and Success;

Have therefore thought fit, with the Advice of His Dajelty's Council, and at the Welire of the house of Representatives, to order that Thursday the Twenty-first of March next be obserbed as a Day of general Fasting and Prayer thro'out this Province; Hereby calling upon Hinisters and People religiously to solemnize the same, by penitent Confession of our many aggravated Sins and Offences (committed under the gracious Dilpenlation of Divine Probidence, in granting many remarkable and undeserved Blestings to us in the Course of the Pear past) and by humble and fervent Supplications to Almighty CDD, to sandify his fatherly Corrections to us, that by these our Iniquities may be purg. I, and that all the Fruit thereof may be to take away our Sins; And that it Would please the Divine Pajesty to confer upon us all needful Bleffings; Particularly, That he Would blefs our sovereign Lord the KING, and grant him Health and long Life, and direct and succeed his Majesty's Councils and Regotiations for advancing the general Prosperity of the Bingdoms and Dominions under his happy Government, and for preferbing a increasing the Tranquility of Europe; Also that GOD would preferbe and blefs their Royal Highnestes the Prince and Princess of Wales, the Duke, and the other Branches of the Royal Family, and continue the Protestant Succession to the Troibn of Great-Britain, to the latest Posterity; That it Would please GOD graciously to direct and prosper the Administrations of the Sovern ment of this Province, and continue to us the Enjoyment of our invaluable Privileges, Relie gious and Civit; That is evould command his Bleffing upon our husvandry, Werchandize and fishery, and prosper the Works of our hands; That he would maintain peace on our 1302= ders, and restore and preserve health in our habitations; Ind above all that he weald grant the gracious Influences of his Holy Spirit to all Orders of idersons among us, that the map reform what is amils, and find Grace in his Dight, and be prepared for a thankful Reception of these and all other Blesungs; And that the Spiritual Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST may come with great power and Glozy: And all servile Labour and Recreations are forbidden on the laid Day.
