PROCLAMATION for a publick FAST.



(A) Theing our indispensable Duty to acknowledge our constant Dependance upon the sovereign, wise and gracious Providence of Almighty GOD, whose Kingdom ruleth over all, and by Prayer and Supplication to make known our Requests to Him; more especially for those publick Blessings which concern our Nation and Land, the universal Interests of Religion, and the Civil Peace and Tranquility throughout the World; and the advancing Spring reminding us of our Duty to implore the Divine Favour, respecting the Affairs and Concerns of the Year now enfuing; and the prefent Afpects of Divine Providence towards

us, together with our many heinous Iniquities, demanding our deepest Humiliation and Repentance;

Dave thought at, with the Advice of his Majetry's Council, to appoint Thursday the Nineteenth Day of April next, to be observed throughout this province as a Day of Fasting and Prayer; hereby calling upon Hinskers and People, as well in private as in their publick Assemblies, religiously to solution is the same by project Consession of their own Sins and the Sins of the People, earnessly imploying the Divine Percy for the Pardon of U our heinous Offences and Provocations, and that he would turn away his Anger from us, and subdue all our Insquities, and make us a resonned and happy Beople; more particularly, that it would please ISD mercifully to direct the Sovernment of this province in all the difficult Affairs which may come before them; that he would confor a publick Spirit on all Person's Whatsoever, especially on such as are in Civil Authority, exciting them to pursue the great Interests of Beligion, and the Peace and Prosperity of their Country; that he would grant us suitable Seasons for the Hulbandry of this Land, that so every Part of the Bear may be crowned with his Goodnels; that he would protect and prosper our Merchandize, Navigation and fishery; that he would continue peace on our Borders, and reflore and preferbe health in our Towns and Unlages; That IDD would graciously please long to continue the Life and Reign of our Sovereign Lord the KING, and protent and defend the Kingdoms and Dominions under his happy Sovernment, and guide and succeed his Pajesty's Counsels for maintaining the Peace of Europe; that lie would grant his especial favour to their Boyal highnesses the Prince of Wales, the Princess Dowager of Wales, the Duke, and all the other Branches of the Royal Family; that he would cause the Protestant Religion to flourish in all Parts of the Christian Wolld; and that the true Knowledge of our Loed and Sabiour TESUS CHRIST may fill the Whole Earth as the Waters cover the Dea. And all fervile Labour and Accreations are prohibited on the faid Day.

GIVEN at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the seventh Day of March, 1753. In the Twenty-fixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
