PROCLAMATION for a publick FAST.

Thaving pleased Almighty GOD, the sovereign Disposer of all Events, to permit the ancient and perfidious Enemy of His Majesty's Kingdoms and Dominions, to obtain some signal Advantages against them, in the Course of the Year past, both in Europe and America; thereby manifesting His righteous Displeature at our provoking Sins, and calling upon us to humble ourfelves under his mighty Hand, to repent of our cvil Deeds, and amend our Lives;

A N D as it becomes us to own the Dispensation of Divine Providence in these great Events; it is incumbent on Us also to acknowledge GOD in all our Ways, by offering up our Prayers and Supplications to Him for his Bleffing upon all our Concerns and Undertakings;

have therefore thought fit, with the Advice of his Majesty's Council, and at the Delire of the house of April next, to be observed as a Day of Publick Fasting and Prayer throughout this province; urging it upon all Ranks and Diders of Den among us religionly to Colemnise the fame, by approaching the Throne of Grace, With humble penitent Confections of our many dins, and with fervent prayers for the Pardon of them; by prefenting also our debout Supplications to Almighty GDD for his Wiefling upon Us, and upon all Gen; Bore especially,

That He would bless our Sovereign Lord the KING, and that in great Mercy to the Nation and its Dependencies, He would be pleased still to preserve his Majesty's most important Life, to strengthen him that he may vanquish and overcome all his Ene-

mies; and to grant, that finally after this Life he may attain everlasting Joy and Felicity;

That He would bleft the Prince of Waler, the Prince's Dowager of Waler, the Duke, and the Rest of the Royal Family: That He would direct and govern his Majesty's Counsel, and the Resolutions of the British Parliament; and over-rule the present Commotions to bring about a firm, safe and lasting Peace; to strengthen the Protestant Cause and Interest; and to spread the Reformation univerfally among the Christian States and Nations:

That He would conduct his Majesty's Fleets and Armin; and give Wisdom, Firmness and Courage to all in Command; and that He would in a particular manner direct and fucceed the Masfures of the General and Commander in Chief of the Forces in North-America, at this most interesting Crisis of Assairs:

That He would guide the Counfels of this Government:

That He would preferve and confirm Health among us; defend the Lives and Properties of such of our Inhabitants as may be more immediately exposed, whether by Sea or Land; and return those who are in Captivity:

That He would grant his Bleffing on our Navigation, Trade and Husbandry; and upon all our lawful Occupations and

Employments:

That He would succeed the Means of Grace among us, and cause the Gospel of his Son to be received and owned by the feveral Indian Tribes in the Land; and to have its genuine Influence and Effect upon their Hearts and Lives: And finally grant,

That the Redeemer's Kingdom may universally take Place, and be established; and that all Men may be brought to know the only true GOD, and JESUS CHRIST, whom He hath fent.

And all Recreations and unnecellary Labour are forbioden on faid Day.

GIVEN at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Eighteenth Day of March, 1757, In the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
