A PROCLAMATION

For a general F A S T.

OR 18 MUCH as it hath pleafed Almighty GOD, in his holy and righteous Providence, to eight the capital Town of this Province, and other Towns within the face, which the contagious Discusse of the Small-Pox, as also with a malignant Fewer, which have present in retail to great Numbers of Persons, (by which the Divine Anger hath been manifested against this People); And whereas there is great Hazard of the spreading of those Discusses in other Parts of this Province, wherehy we are loudly called upon to humble curscives and in the mighty Hand of GOD;

Dave therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Council, and at the Delice of the House of Representatives, to appoint Thursday the Second Day of July new, to be observed as a Day of General Fasting and Prayer throughout this week nee; hereby calling on both Ministers and People to solemnize the same by pentent Confession of our many and aggravated Iniquities (the procuring Cause of these and other Judgments and Calamities instituted on Us,) and by humble and ference both increased to the Divine Majesty to sandify the Dispensations of his provied mere both increased and assistive, to the purging away of our Iniquities, and to the bringing about a sincere and thorough Resonation in Persons of all Orders among 125; and that SOD would turn away his Anger from us; restore health, and prosper us in all our religious and civil Interests; and that the Spiritual Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour FESUS CHRIST - by be advanced, and the Whole Carth be silted with his Slopy. And all service Labour and Recreations are solviden on said Day.

AND upon due Confideration of the present distressed Circumstances of the Town of Boston;

This carnelly recommended to all charitable and well disposed Persons to contribute on the Day asociaid, for the Relief of the Poor of said Town as they judge proper; that so our Alms, as well as our Prayers, may come up for a Pennorial before DD.
