A PROCLAMATION for a publick FAST.



PON Contideration of the ufual Occasions of the Spring and Summer entuing; as also of the present Conjuncture of our publick Affairs, upon the Success of which under GOD, the future and lafting Prosperity of this and the neighbouring Provinces does greatly depend ;

have thought fit, with the Advice of his Pajetty's Council, to appoint Thursday the Iwenty third Day of March Instant, to be observed as a Day of publick Falting and Prayer throughout this Province: Hereby calling upon Thinifers and people religiously to attend the same, by humble and penitent Consession of our Dins, which have incensed the righteous Anger of Almighty GOD against us, manifested in the publick Calamities instituted upon us; and earnestly to implose the Divine Wercy so, the pardon of our many hemous Offences; and for conferring upon us all necessary Bleflings; particularly, for the health and long Life of our sovereign Lord the KING, their Royal highnestes the Prince and Princes of Wales, the Duke, and the rest of the Royal Family; and for defeating all Attempts against the Proteslant Succession in that illustrious house; Direction and Succels on his Bajelty's Countels and Administrations, and for the Prospective of the Kingdoms and Dominions under his happy Government; for the gracious Induceres of Divine Providence on the Peace lately restored to the Nations, that so the Events thereof may be governed for the Safety and Advantage of the Protestant Cause, and the particular Benefit of the British Dominions; That it would please GOD to bless the Government of this Province, and direct and prospec the Administrations thereof for the publick Good; and particularly, that our important Affairs now depending in the Court of Great-Britain may be that our important Affairs now depending in the Court of Great-Britain may be that our important Affairs now depending in the Court of Great-Britain may be fo conducted and succeeded as to be a Deans to establish Justice in our general Dealings, as also Frigality, Diligence, and other Clientes, which may render us a happy People; That it would please GOD to grant us suitable Seasons for the Fruits of the Earth, and in his due Time a plentiful Harbest; That our Perchandize and Fishery may be protected from the Ravages of Pirates, and all other Disasters; That he would continue health among us, and prevent the foresting of any mostal or contagious Aichness. the spreading of any mortal or contagious Dickness, That he would return the Remainder of our Captibes; That he would prolong our Religious and Civil Privileges; And above all, That he would revive the Power and Practice of Godliness among the Christian Nations; And that the spiritual Kingdom of our Lord and Daviour JESUS CHRIST may be greatly enlarged, and the whole Earth be filled with his Hory. And all service Labour and Recreations are forbidden on the laid Day.
