PROCLAMATION for a publick FAST.



T having pleased Almighty GOD to manifest his righteous Anger towards this People, in causing a mortal Sickness to prevail in divers Towns in this Province in the Year past; which there is just Reason to fear may be followed by still greater and more general Calamities, if we remain impenitent: And as the opening Spring leads us to acknowledge our entire Dependence upon the Father of Mercies for a Bleffing upon all the Occasions and Concerns of the ensuing Year;

have thought fit, with the Advice of his Majesty's Council, to appoint Thursday the Fourth of April next, to be observed as a Day of Fasting and Prayer throughout this Province; Hereby calling upon Ministers and Deople, With the deepest humiliation and Contrition, to confess and bewall their own Ding and the Dins of the People, and to afcribe Righteousness to SDD in all the Corrections of his holy hand, devortipacknowledging his undeferved Patience and Goodnels in mixing so much Hercy with his Judgments; and earnestly to supplicate the wardon of our manifold and aggrabated Transgressions, and that he would turn away his Anger from us, and beliver us from our just fears of his threatned Judgments, and confer upon us all needful Blessings spiritual and temporal: Particularly, That it would please GOD (by whom Kings reign) to bless our Sovereign Lord the King, the Prince of Wales, the Duke, and the rest of the Royal Family With long Life and Health; That he Would direct and prosper Dis Pajelty's Counsels (particularly those of the high Court of Parliament) for the Sccurity and happinels of the British Nation, and for the Preservation of the general Peace of Europe; That he would gracioully incline the several Governments of his Majesty's Colonies in North-America, ro unite in such Dealures as may be for their common Safety and Prosperity, and for frustra ting all Deligns that may be formed against them; That GDD would grant his gracious Influences on the Counsels and Administrations of this Government, moze especially for preferbing Peace on our Borders and preventing the Calamitics of War; That he would refroze and continue Health in our Towns and Plantations; That he Would mercifully favour the Husbandry of this Land, and grant us such suitable Insuences of the Heavens, as that the Carth may yield it's Increale, and provide food convenient both for Man and Bealt; That he would prosper our Trade and Navigation and other Works of our hands; That he would continue our religious and civil Liberties: And above all, That he would make us a penitent reformed People; and cause Industry, Frugality and Temperance, and all other moral and ian Aertues to prevail among us; And that the faving Knowledge of the only true sion of our Lord JESUS CHRIST may be propagated in it's Power and Practice among he Mations of the Earth, and that no Meapon formed against it may prosper, and that cy Longue that rifes against it in Judgment may be condemned. And all service Labour and Recreations are prohibited on the said Day.

GIVEN at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Sixteenth Day of March, 1754, in the Twenty-Seventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GUD, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
