A PROCLAMATION for a general FAST.

ORASMUCH as this Government has with great Expence and Labour raifed and fitted out a large Body of Troops, and equipped a confiderable Naval Force for an Expedition against the French at Cape-Breton, which Forces are now, thro' the Favour of Divine Providence, embarked, and have taken their Departure from this Place; And for a finished GOD, to give Wisdom and Conduct to our Officer, and Butches. in the gracious Prefence of Almighty GOD, to giveWifdom andConduct to our Officers, and Refolution and Courage both to Officers and Soldiers, to preferve our Forces from Sickness and other Disasters, and to govern all Accidents and Occurrences fo as to render them favourable to our Defigns; And as it is our indiffenfible

Duty by Prayer and Supplication with penitent Confession of our Sins earnestly to implore the gracious Interpolition of divine Providence, that it would pleafe GOD to be on our Side and fight our Battles, and grant a Success and Victory;

have therefore thought fit with the Advice of his Majely's Council, to appoint Thursday the Fourth Day of April next, to be observed throughout this Province as a Day of Festing and Prayer, hereby calling upon Pinisters and Propie, as well in their private Devotions, as in their publick Affemblies, with a truly humble and contrite Spirit to confess and bewail the many and great Offences of this People, Whereav GOD may be julily provoked to blast all our Deligns in this Cuterprize, and bring upon us the most beavy and wasting Calamities; and to cry mightily to him, that he would in his abundant Hercy through CHRIST, forgive all our Trespasses and make us a religious and reformed Deeple, and thereby prepare us for all temporal Prosperity: And more electativ, that they do under a deep Denle of the universal Providence of Almighty GOD, whereby he governs all Can es and Events according to his own wife and sovereign pleas fure, with humble and unpertunate Prayers befeech him to keep Din, the accursed Thing that provokes his rule Indignation, but of the Camp and fleet; and that he Would graciously order all the Cocumbances of this enterprize in Mercy to this people; and that he would prosper and fuccers it for the future Safety and Prosperity of This and the other British Provinces and Colonies, for His is the Power, the Glory, and the Victory. And after all, humbly 3 dutifully to submit this great Affair to his wife and fovereign Determination, that fo in all Respects this may be such a Fast as GDD has required, and a Day of Atonement and not of further Prodocation; And that it would also please GDD to give Success to the Arms of his Gajesty and his Allies in the Operations of the ensuing Summer; And that Peace may be restored both in Europe and in America, And that the universal Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST, the Prince of Peace, may prevail in the Morld, and the whole Earth be fill with His Glory. And all service Labour and Recreations are Arialy forbidden on the faid Day.

Given at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Twenty-fifth Day of March, 1745. In the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD, of GREAT-BRITAIN, FRANCE and IRELAND, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
