A PROCLAMATION for a publick FAST.



T being our indispensable Duty to acknowledge GOD in all our Ways, and by Preyer and Supplication with Thanksgiving to make known our Requests to Him; And the present afflicted State of our Nation and Land, in the Continuance of an expensive and destructive War, as well as our Dependence on Almighty GOD for Success in all the Enterprizes and Operations thereof, and for His Blessing upon us in all our other Affair, and Interests in the ensuing Year, requiring at this Season our publick and solemn Supplications;

have thought fit, with the Advice of his Majelty's Council, to appoint Thursday the Twentycighth of April next to be observed as a Day of Fasting and Prayer thro'out this Probince; hereby calling upon Binisters and people with the deepest Contrition and Humiliation to consess and bewait their own Hins and the Hins of this People, and to acknowledge the Righteousness of GDD in all the Calamities he has brought upon us, and to adoze his infinite Patience and Goodness in mixing so much Percy with his Judgments; and earnessly to imploze his Compassion towards us, that he would pardon our many hemous Offences & turn away his Anger from us and graciously visit us with his favous, Particularly, That it would please GOD by whom Kings Reign, to bless our most gracious Sovereign with long Life and health, to direct and prosper the Counsels and Administrations of the civil Government of our Nation, and to give Success to his Majesty's Arms and the Arms of his Ailies so reducing the Power of our Enemies, and for restoring a just, safe and honourable Prace; That the Dibine Bleffing may always reft on their Royal Digineffes the Prince and Princels of Wales, the Duke and the other Branches of the Royal Family, and that the Protestant Succession in that illustrious bouse map bescend to the latest posterity, and all Attempts against it blasted; That I would grant the gracious protection to all the British Colonies and Provinces in America, and more especially to this Province; That he would fecure our Dea-Coafts and Inland-Frontiers from Invalions, and defeat all the Deligns of our enemies against us; That he would direct the Administrations of the Government of this Province in their difficult and important Affairs, elpecially those that relate to the War, and lead us into luch Deafures as may promote the publick Tranquillity; That he would mercifully grant us fuitable Scalons for the husbandry of this Land, that fo every part of the Dear may be crowned with his Goodnels; Thathe would continue our Bealth and prevent mortal Dicknels from breaking in and spreading among us; That he would protect our Mabigation & profper our Trade; And above all, That the Christian Religion, in its Purity & Power. may be greatly advanced in our Nation and Land, and that all Nations may be brought into the spiritual Kingdom of our Lord and Daviour JESUS CHRIST, and that the whole Earth may be filled with His Glory. And all scribile Labour and Recreations are forbidden on faid Day.

Given at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Twenty-fifth Day of March 1 748. In the Twenty-first Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD of GREAT-BRITHIN, FRANCE, and IRELAND, KING, Defender of the Faith, Ge.
