## A PROCLAMATION for a general FAST.

W in

HEREAS it has pleafed Almighty GOD to manifest His righteous Anger, in the Continuance of the expensive and destructive War, in which the Nations of Europe are involved (notwithstanding the Overtures which have been made for bringing the same to a happy Conclusion) and, in his sovereign and holy Providence, to distinguish this Province by rendering the Burthens and Calamitics of War remarkably grievous and distressing to it, in the Number of People that have been slain and captivated by the Enemy, and have perished by Sickness and other Disaster, and by taking

off so many of our People from the Business of the Husbandry; whereby (as well as thro' the Unsuitableness of the Weather in the several Sensons of the last Year) the Necessaries of Life are become scarce and dear; And whereas the Spring Season is now advancing, and our great Dependence for the Fruitfulness of the ensuing Year, as well as in all our other publick Interests and Concerns, is on the Divine Favour and Blessing;

have thought at, with the advice of his Majety's Council, and at the Delire of the honse of Representatives, to appoint Thursday the Night Day of April next, to be observed as a Day of publick Palling and Prayer throughout this Province; hereby cailing upon Ministers and People religions to attend the Duties of the Day, by hamble and penitent Consession of the many and aggravated Sins of this people, and Athnobledgement of the Justice of GOD in the Infrances of his great Despicature against us for one manifold Offences, more especially for our Ancoragivicuels under his Jindyments, and Unthandfuinels under the liqual Succelles and Deliverances he has granted to us in the Pears pake, And with our Confession of Sin, to some surface and fervent Supplications to Almighty GOD for the Life of our Severeign Lord the KING, the divine Direction and Conduct to his Pajelly's Counters, and Souteris to from Arms, and the Arms of his Allies, for reducing the Poider of our Encuies and bringing their under the Arms of his Allies, for reducing the Poider of our Encuies and bringing for under the Acceller of agreeing to a fold and laking Peace: That it would please GOD to bless their Royal dighneffes the Prince and Princes of Wals, the Dule, and the rest of the Royal Findly: That he would bourhase his wise and gracious Inductive upon the Countries and Administration of the Government of this Province, especially in the important Affairs of the actar, protent our Sea-Coafts and Juland Frontiers from the Javahous and Depredations of eur Enemies, and prosper all our Enterprises against them; That he would continue our sealth, and grant us suitable Sections for the Fruits of the Earth, and in due Time afford us a plentiful parbelt; That he idenid preferbe and comfort our Capities, and fucced the Peans for their Octiverance; Dear by Would revive our decaying Drave, That he would grant us a long Continuance of our Religious and Civil Privileges; and above all fandify to us the various Dispensations of his providence, and beget in us an authorial Repentance and Reformation, and that the Power of Sodinels may prevail in our Pation and Land, and that the whole Earth may be filed with the Knowledge of our Lord and Savienr Jesus Chirist. And all fervile Labour and Recreations are forbidden on the faid Day.

Given at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Twenty-little of Made, 1700. In the Twenteth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord GFORGF the Second, by the Grace of GOD of Great Britain, the sace, and Isrosane, KING, Defende on the Febr. Go.
