## A PROCLAMATION for a publick FAST.



PON Consideration of the great Affairs now in Agration both in Europe and America, on the Direction and Success of which the Honour and Safety of His Majesty's Government, and the Prosperity of his Subjects in all Parts of his Dominions, do, under GOD, so much depend; sensidering also the usual Occasions of the Spring and of the Summer ensuing, upon which it is our indispensable Duty to implore the Divine Blessing;

Dabe thought fit, With the Advice of his Majelp's Council, and at the Delice of the Houle of Reprelens the bes, to appoint Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of April Inftant, to be observed as a Day of publick Fafting and Prayer thro'out this probince; hereby calling apon Ministers and people to folemnize the fame by penitent Confession of their own Sins, and laminting the general Bepravity of the People of this Land, whereby the rightcous Anger of Aimighty Cho is incensed against us, and manifested in various Diftreiling Jungme ses and awfut Threatnings of futther Calamities; and humbly and carneftly to Supplicate the Living Percy for removing the Effeus of his mit Anger, and in the mean Kime landisping his Probidential Dispensations, both of Percy and Judgment, for producing a general and fincere Repentance and Reformation; and also, that it would please GOD to prolong the important Life of our Sovereign Lord the KING, and graciously direct and succeed his Pajesty's Counsels and Administrations, and the Counsels and Resolutions of Parliament, so, the Safety and Descuce of his Bajelty's Dominions, and for the Recobering his jult Rights and the Properties of his Subjects from the Invalions of their French Reighbours, and for preventing the further Effulion of Blood by restoring a settled Peace to the Nations; that it would please GOD to confer the best of Blessings upon their Royal Highnesses the Prince of Wales, the Princels Dowager of Wales, the Duke, and the rest of the Royal Family; that he would have a compassionate Regard to the present calamitous Condition of his Bajesty's Provinces and Colonics in America, and Deliber them from the cruel Bavages of a perfidious Cenemy, and Would graciously direct and prosper the Counsels and Enterprizes of the several British Governments for recovering their just Rights; particularly, that GOD wonto graciously guide and succeed the Consultations and Resolutions of this Government in all their important Affairs, and so other our military preparations and Enterprizes as that they may have a happy Mue; that he would befend our sca-Coalis and Inland Frontiers from all holdile Attempts of our Enemies; that he would reflore Liberty to our Captives, and in the mean Time effectually preferbe them from all Deduction to a faile Religion; that he Would continue Bealth, and prebent contagious and mortal Tutempers from entring and spreading among us; that he would favour the Husbandry of this Land, so that the Earth may preld it's Increale, and afford food lufficient for Ban and Beaft; and more efpecially, that it would please a merciful GOD to awaken and buly affed a guilty and stupid World by the awful Dispensations of his Probidence in the late Earthquakes, Inundations, and other remarkable Inftances of his righteous Deberity ; and wifely over rule them for the Propagation of the holy Religion of our Lord and habiour Jesus Christ; and that the whole Earth may be filled with his Glory: And all ferbile Labour and Recreations are forbidden on faid Day.

Given at the Cancil-Chamber in Boston, the nines Day of April, 1756, in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE, the Second, by the Grave of GOD of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c.
