A Proclamation for a publick FAST.

HEREAS divers Expeditions have been projected, and are now in Profecution for the Removal of the Encroachments made upon His Majesty's Territories, and for the Preservation and Security of the Rights and Possessions of His Majesty's Subjects in North-America; and whereas it is incumbent on Us, in a more especial Manner, to implo e the Divine Favour and Blesling when we are engaged in Affairs of great Moment and Importance;

Dave therefore thought fit, with the Advice of his Najesty's Council, and at the Delire of the Assembly, to appoint Thursday the third Day of July next, to be observed throughout this province as a Day of publick Fasting and Prayer; hereby calling upon Dinisters and People religiously to solem= nize the same, by a humole and penitent Confession of our manifold aggravated Dins, Whereby We have provoked the just Anger of Almighty GDD; and by earnest Supplication to him, that he would grant us his pardoning Merci, thro' the great Adediator, with the powerful Aids of his holy Spirit, to work a thorough Reformation in the hearts and Lives of this People; That he usuid graciously since upon the Weasures which are now in Prosecution for the Res covery and Security of his Pajely's Territories in America, Which have been so unjustly and persolously invaded by our French De ghbours; That he would direct the Counsels, and succeed the Endeavours of this Government, for the Protection of our Frontiers, against the Inroads of the Indian Sabages; that he would mercifully prevent the Calamity of a general War, and that he would hasten the happy Times when the Nations shall learn War in more, When our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST, the bleffed and only Boten= tate, and the Prince of Peace, Mall invone all Partons to himself. And all scivile Labour and Recreations are forbioden on said Day.

Given at the Council Chamber in Boston, the Ninth Day of June 1755. the Twenty eighth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign LORD GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of Faith, &c.
