## A PROCLAMATION-

For a General F A : T.

Providence of GOD; that all Events in Heaven and in Earth are over-ruled by infinite Wildom and Goodness, and directed to the most glorious Ends, humbly and gratefully to acknowledge the same, and fervently to implore the divine Favor and Protection: So at this season of public Diffress and Calamity; when the Hand of a cruel and remorfeless Enemy is stretched out against us; when the Banners of Slavery hang trembling over our Heads, and destructive War in all its Horrors rages thro' this once peaceful Land, it is our more immediate Duty, as a People, unitedly and solemnly, in the Name of the great Mediator, to offer up our most fervent Supplications to the Throne of Grace, humbly befeeching Almighty GOD to remove these desolating Judgments; to have Compassion on the Vine which his own Right-Hand hath planted, and while the Hand of Vielence is aiming to pluck it up by the Roots, to be its Desender and Shield, and in the End to cause his People to rejoice in the GOD of their Salvation.

HE COUNCIL and House of Representatives of this STATE, have therefore thought fit to appoint, and do hereby appoint Webnesday the Twenty-ninth Day of January instant, to be observed as a Day of public HUMILIATION, FACTING and PRAYER throughour this STATE, calling upon all Ranks and Lincommunity of Men among us to unite; in humbly confessing our manifold Sin- against the Majesty of Ficaven; in devoutly imploying Pardon for them all, through the Wedlation of the great Redeemer; in earnestly implicating for a Spirit of universal Reformation manifesting itself in the Fruits of Holiness and Righteousness. That it would please the Father of Lights to give Wisdom to the Continental Congress, and to our feveral Assemblies; Prudence and Fortitude to our Generals, and military Officers; Courage and a Love of Discipliac to our Soldiers, and in allEncounters with the Enemy that, he would be their Shield and Buckler: That HE would fafe-guard our Fortresses, and defend our Sea-Coasts and Frontiers; That HE would prosper the necessary Use of our Arms to the important Purposes of restoring Peace, Liberty and Happiness; That an End might be put to the Effution of human Blood; that not only our own Hearts, but the Hearts of our Enemies might be turn'd to him from whom they have back-flidden; and that in the End thefe States with all the States and Kingdoms of this World, may become the Kingdoms of our LORD and of his CHRIST, and there may be mone to hurt or destroy throughout the Earth.

And all servile Labour and Recreation are forbidden on said Day.
