A PROCLAMATION.

For a General FAST.

Character and circumstance of Life rest entirely upon the unmerited Favour of Almighty GOD, as the Seasons of the Year are under his immediate Direction, and all the Events of War at his disposal: And whereas it hath pleased the Supreme Ruler notwithstanding the many fignal interpositions of his gracious Providence in the vigorous and noble Stand made for our invaluable Liberties and Rights to suffer the cruel Sword of our unmatural Foes to remain unsheathed in our Land; and under a deep Sense of the Tokens of GOD's righteous Displeasure occasioned by the Unrighteousness and Impiety found in the midst of us, and the absolute Necessity of immediate Repentance, and Reformation:

WE Have thought fit to appoint, and do hereby appoint THURSDAY the Twenty-ninth Day of APRIL next, to be observed as a Day of Public HUMILIATION, FASTING, and PRAYER throughout this STATE, earnestly recommending that People of all Ranks and Denominations do affemble themselves at their respective Places of public Worship, to make humble and penitent Confession of their manifold and aggravated Transgressions against the Majesty of Heaven, a devout Application for Pardon and Fosgiveness through the Mediation of our great Redeemer, and hat Confession and Prayer be accompanied with immediate and universal Reformation, as the only rational ground of Hope that GOD will remove the desolating Judgments we feel, and divert those our aggravated Guilt deserve. And while at the Throne of Grace, it is most earnestly recommended, that this whole People at deady pray that GOD would most graciously order the ensuing lear, granting us a suitable Seed Time and a plentiful Harvest. That the Health of this People may be precious in his Sight. That he would prefide in the Cone ages of these Vaiced States That he had been been the Legislative and executive a owers in this scale. That on which is our reploated and Ruin, may be taken from us, and that by Righteouineis we may be exalted. That the bleffing of JEHOVAH may reft upon us and our benevolent and respectable ALLIES. That the LORDof HOSTS and GOD of ARMIES would inspire our Generals, and other Military Officers with Prudence and Fortitude, and our Soldiers with undaunted Courage. That it would please the righteous Ruler of the World, the common Parent of Mankind, to commend an End to the Effusion of Human Bleed, restore and establish on Just and lasting Foundations definable Tranquility. That Peace, Truth, and Righteonfacis, may reign through all the Earth. That the glorious Gospel of JESUS CHRIST may be published and received among all Nations, and the Knowledge and here of GOD ful the Earth, as the Waters cover the Sca.

And all fervile LABOUR and RECREATION are forbidden on faid Day.
