## A Proclamation for a General FAST.

TERROTERORASMUCH as every Mercy we stand inNeed of, or hope to receive, deg pends upon the kind Providence of the ALMIGHTY, its our indispensible Duty, to humble ourselves before Him, to beg the Forgiveness of our Repeated Transgressions, to implore his kind Protection, and the benevolent Grant of such Mercies as we may stand in Need of, particularly, in the Course of the present Year, and that we may have an Opportunity of performing this our bounden Duty in the most public and solemn Manner;

HAVE tho't fit, by and with the Advice of his MAJESTY'S COUNCIL, to Order and Appoint Wednesday the Twenty First Day of this Instant May, to be observed and kept as a Day of Fasting and Prayer throughout this Province, hereby Exhorting both Ministers and People to assemble and solemnize the same, by devoting a reasonable Part of said Day to the public Worship of Almighty GOD, in sincerely repenting of our past Iniquities, and ardently imploring his Forgiveness of them, and humbly Relying on his most gracious Protection for the future.

That he would shower down his Blessings on the Kingdom of Great-Britain, and the Dominions thereof.

That he would extend his Benevolence to our Sovereign Lord King George the Third, in granting him a long, prosperous, peaceable and happy Reign over all his Subjects.

That he would be graciously pleased to sanctify to his Majesty, and the whole Nation, the Loss they have sulfained in the lateDeaths of their Royal Highnesses theDuke of Cum-BERLAND, and Prince Fredrick William.

That he would be pleafed to bless and preserve our gracious Queen CHARLOTTS, their Royal Highnesses Grorge Prince of Wales, the Princess Downger of Wales, the Princes and all the Royal Family.

That we may enjoy the happy Fruits of the present general Peace, without any Murmuring or Repining in any Part of His Majesty's Dominions.

That we may be favour'd with the Blestings slowing from a suitable Seed Time and plentiful Harvett.

That the Administration of this Government may be under the benign Influence and Guidance of divine Providence.

That we may be preserved from epedimical and contagious Distempers.

That the everlasting Gospel of Jesus Christ may prevail and flourish throughout all And all service Labour and Recreations are strictly forbidden on said Day. the Earth.

Given at Portsnouth, at Arms, this 6th Day of May, in the Sixth Year of the Reign of our most gracious Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c. &c. 1706. B. WENTWORTH.
