## A Proclamation for a Publick THANKSGIVING



HEREAS it hath pleafed Almighty GOD (notwithstanding the Provocation of His holy Displeasure by our Sins, testified in divers Instances, and particularly in the late Instances out and Mortal Distances) to tavour us with many undeferved Blessings in the Course of this Year, which do justly demand our humble Adoration and thankful Acknowledgement of the divine Goodness;

pape therefore thought be, with the lovice of his Pafely's Cuncil, To Appoint Thurklay the Twelith of November next, a Day of Publick THANKS-GIVING throughout this Produce. Hereby Exhoring both Pinifers and people in their leveral Allembies, Religiously to soleming the same by offering no their fincere and grateful PRAISES for the manifold Blessings and Fadours which GOD of his undeserved Goodness hath confer'd upon us; Pairicularly, in continuing to us the indatuable Life of Our Hobercign Lord the KING, with his Royal Consort Our most Gracious QUEEN, his Royal highness the Prince of Wale, and the Rest of the Royal Flue; In succeeding his Pajesty's wife Councils, for Restoring and Chablishing the Peace of Europe; In Prolonging the Eccelcliastical and Civil Privileges of this People; In granting his gracious Conduct and Assistance in the Administration of the Civil Government of this Province; In Restoring Health to many of our Towns lately visited with a contagious Distemper, and preferbing others from the Insection thereof; In maintaining our PBACE with the Indian Natives, and granting us a plentiful Harvest, in giving Success to our Merchandize and Fishery, and protecting it from the Insults and Rabages of Pirates, Lich other numberless Instances of the divine Beneficence: And all Service Labour is prohibited on the said Day.
