## A Proclamation for a publick THANKSGIVING.

NDER a just and affecting Sense of the infinite Goodness of Almighty GOD, and the many particular Instances of His undescribed Favour and Bounty towards this People, more especially in the Course of the Year past;

have thought st, with the Advice of his Pajesty's Council, to other a appoint that Thursday the Twenty-Sixth of October next, be solemnized throughout this Probince, as a Day of publick THANKSGIVING, exhorting both Pinisters and People in their respedibe Assemblies, religiously to observe the same, by rendring their thankful Acknowledgments of the divine Goodnels, in the various Blessings so liberally conferred on us, and by offering up their uncere and devout PRAISES to the Sovereign Author of all our Percies; especially, Forhis preserving the precious Life of our Sovereign Lord the KING, with our most gracious QUEEN, his Royal highness the France of Wa'c, the Luke, and the rest of the Royal Family; for succeeding his Barcity's wife Councils for the preservation and continuance of the Peace of Europe in this critical Conjunture; for prolonging the Eccleliastical and Civil Privileges of this People: for granting his gracious Conduct and Assistance in the Administration of the Civil Sovernment of this Province; giving Us so good a measure of Health; for maintaining our Peace With the Indian Natives; for granting us so plintiful a flavelt; for making our Merchandize and Fishery to prosper, and desending them against the Rapine of merciless Pirates; With innumerable other unmerited Kavours, Which lav us under the deepest Obligations of Obedience and Gratitude toour most bountiful Benefaco: And all service Labour and Recreations are prohibited on the faid Day.
