vade therefore thought fit, with the Advice of His Majely's Council, to order a appoint Thursday the Thirteenth Day of November next to be observed as a Day of publick THANKSGIVING throughout this Province; hereby exhorting both Ministers and People to Colemnize the came, by offering up their lincere and debout PRALE to Almighty GDD, the Author of all our Percies, for the innumerable Blestings bestolied upon an univorthy & linful People, more especially, In preserving the Person of our device reign Lord the KING, and directing his Majesty's Councils, and in prospering his Majesty's Councils, and in prospering his Majesty's Councils, and in prospering his Majesty's jesty's Arms in the present War, which he has undertaken for vindicating the house it of Dis Crown, and afferting the Rights of his Subjects; In continuing the Lives of their Royal Highnestes the Prince and Princess of Wales, and the rest of the Royal Issue; In prolonging our invaluable Privileges religious and civil; In giving his gracious Direction and Allistance to the Administrations of the Government of this Province; In crowning the Wear with his Goodnels and granting to us the Joy of harvelt; In the good meafure of health enjoyed in most places within the sprovince; In defending our Sea Coasis, and securing our Trade and Navigation from the Insults and Depredations of our Enemies; And in preferving and prospering our Infant Plantations; With numbers less other Percies, Which tay us under indispensible Obligations to Gratitude and Obes Dicuce, and to Fear the LORD and His Goodness, and to walk worthy of Him, to all wellpleasing.
