

By the Honorable CADWALLADER COLDEN, Esq; His Majesty's Lieutenant Governor, and Commander in Chief of the Province of New-York, and the Territories depending thereon in America.

A Proclamation,

HEREAS it hath pleafed Almighty GOD to permit the fincere and incessint Labours of Our Most Gracious Sovereign to restore the publick Tranquility, to be frustrated by the Obstinacy of the French King, who, notwithstanding the visible Interposition of Heaven in owning the Justice of our Cause, by blessing His Majesty's Arms with so many signal Victories and important Conquests, not only persists in resusing the most reasonable Terms of Accommodation, but hath prevailed on the King of Spain to apouse his anjust Cause, whereby we are exposed to the Calamities of a new and more extensive War. And as it becomes us with all Humility to have Recourse to those Means which GOD hath graciously pointed out to us for securing the Continuance of His Divine Favour and Protection:

I Have therefore thought by to Appoint, And I DO, by and with the Advice of His Majetty's Council, Ordain and Appoint that FRIDAY the Shven ru Day of Mall next be fet apart and observed, throughout this Province, for the folemn Humiliation of ourselves before Almighty GOD with Prayer and Fathing; to supplicate the Pardon of our Sins, thro' the Mediation of our Blessed Redeemer; to deprecate those heavy Judgments which we have most justly deserved; and to implore the Continuance of the Divine Bleffing, on His Majetty's Arms, and for restoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Prosperity to His Majesty, His Kingdoms and Colonies. And all His Majesty's Subjects within this Province, are strictly commanded to observe the faid publick FAST with becoming Reverence and Devotion, by attending the publick Worthip of GOD, which is hereby directed and enjoined to be performed on that Day, in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of Worship: Notice whereof is to be given by the feveral Incumbents and Ministers, by reading this Proclamation, in due Time, to their respective Congregations. And all servile Labour is prohibited on the faid Day.
