hereas it hath pleased Almighty God in his Providence towards As and Dur People, to Panifest his Power and Wercy, in Discovering and Delivering Us from a horrid and Barbarous Conspiracy of Papills, and other Traiterous Persons, to Assaliance and Purper Our Royal Person, and from an Invasion intended by the French upon this Kingdom, Objeredy not only the Destruction of Our Royal Person was Plotted and Intended, but the Total Subversion of Our Gobernment, and of Michelsion, Laws and Liversies of this Realm: And Objered the Total Subversion of this Realm: And Objered the Constitution of Assaliance Assaliance Constitution for Appointing a Day of Solemn Thanksgiving to Almighty God, so, Our happy Deliverance from the said Litlanous and Barbarous Consuracy against Our Koyal Declar, and from the

and Barbarous Consorrary against Dur Royal Person, and from the said intended Invalid : The therefore Adding the Divine Godnels, and duly Considering that such Great and Publick Blessings do call for Publick and Holemn Acknowledgments, have thought sit (by the Advice of Dur Privy Council) to Issue this Dur Royal Proclamation, hereby Appointing and Commanding, That a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God so, these his Hercies, be Obsteved throughout this Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Thursday the Historian Day of April next. And so, the better, and more orderly Holemnizing the same, the have given Directions to the most Reverend the Arch-Bishops, and Right Reverend the Bishops of this Kingdom, to Compose a Koum of Prayer Huitable to this Occasion, to be Also in all Churches and Chappels, and other Places of Publick Morthy, and to take Care so, the timely Dispersing of the same throughout their respective Discress. And the do strictly Charge and Command, That the said Publick Day of Chanksgiving be Religiously Observed by all Our Loving Hubers, as they Lender the Kabour of Almighty God, and upon Hain of suffering such Pumishment as the can justly Institution all such who shall Contemn or Negelea the same.
