And so, the better and more orderly Solemnizing the same, such have given Directions to the most Reverend the Archbishops and Right Reverend the Bishops of this Kingdom, to Compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be Aske Care so, the timely Dispersing of the same throughout their respective Discess. And soe do strictly Charge and Command that the said Publick Day of Thanksgiving be Religiously Observed by all Our Loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of instring such Punishment, as save can suffly Institution all such Who shall Contemn of Regleat the same. fuch Who hall Contenin or Aegled the fame.

Given at Our Court at Kensington the Seventeenth Day of November, 1697. In the Ninth Year of Our Reign.
