For a THANKSGIVING for the late VICTORY

His Majesties Naval Forces.

Vereas it bath pleased Almighty God in his late Providence towards Us and Our People, to manifest at once the glozy both of his power and Wercy, in giving Us a happy Uictory over Our Adversaries at Sea, filling the hearts of Us and Our People as full of joy and thankfulness, as becomes so transcendent a Percy; the cannot upon the due confideration hereos, but with all humility admire and adore the mercy and goodness of God in this his figual manifestation thereos, and the look upon it as an indication from Headen to Us and all Our People unto most entire thankfulness for the same. the end some Solemn time may be set apart for the publick personmance of this Duty; and that Albert and all Dur Subjects in England and Wales, and the Town of Berwick upon Tweed, may pay Dur just tribute of Praise and Thanksibing to Almighty God. Alle do hereby Publish and Declare, and also strictly Charge and Command. That Tuckay the Twentieth day of this instant June be set apart and observed as a day of Publick Chanksibing in the Cities of London and Westminster, Borough of Southwark, and other places adjacent. And that Tuckay the Kourth of July next, the like be kept and duely observed through the rest of this whole Realm of England, and Dominion of Wales. And for the more orderly personmance thereof, sue by the addice of Dur Rederend Bishops, have directed to be Composed, Printed and Published, the Korms of such Prayers and publish Dectings; and have given charge to Dur Bishops to disperse the same throughout the whole Kingdom. And sue do also direct and some, That this Dur Proclamation be published in all Churches and Chappels, on some Lords-day precedent to the said days of Thanksishing hereby appointed, to the end that notice may be taken thereof, and due thanks and praise may upon the said days be offered up unto Almighty God; And that humble supplications be poured out before him sor his continual allistance, and improbement of this and all his mercies to the honour of his great Pame, and the peace and benefit of As and Dur People; Illishing and Arictly Commanding all persons within Dur said Realm and Dominions, with all sobriety, reberence, and thanksulness to observe this day, as becomes so solemn an occasion.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the Fourteenth day of June, 1665. in the Seventeenth year of Our Reign.
