A PROCLAMATION

For a Solemn and Publick Thanksgiving throughout the Kingdom, for His Majesties late Victories over the Rebels.

JAMES R.

13. July . 1685.



hereas it hath pleased Almighty God in the beginning of Our Reign to manifel his great Goodness towards Us and Our Kingdoms, in giving Us so Absolute and Signal Uivoies over the late Revels, who in Contempt of the Laws of God and of these Kingdoms, rose up against Us in open Revellion, threat ning the Subversion of the Peace and Tranquility of Our Kingdoms, where by it hath pleased him in his Infinite Percy not only to Resoze to Us and Our Kingdoms a perfect Peace by an utter Dissipation of all those Revels, but like wife to deliver into Our Hands the Chief Heads of that Horrid Traiterous Conspiracy in order to their Condign Punishment, that thereby nothing might

remain to interrupt Dur peaceable Government for the future: Upon the due Consideration Whereof, The do with all humility Admire and Adoze the late Percy and Soodness of Sod in giving Usnory to Dur Arms and delibering Us and Dur Kingdoms from the Piseries and Calamities that
might and constantly do ensue an Intestine and Annatural Rebelion. And Considering that
such Signal and Hublick Percies are Indications from Peaven to Us and all Dur Subjects to
tender the most publick and chearful Expersions of Thankfulness to the Divine Soodness, We are
willing that the just Aribute of Piaise and Thankgiving to Dur great Sovereign the King of
peaven and Earth be solemnly returned by Us and all Dur People for this his late Percey. And
the end some solemn Time may be appointed for the publick performance of this Duty, that all
Dur Subjects in England and wales and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, who equally have in the
Blessing and Joys of th's Deliberance, may be united in the Debotions which are offered for it;
The do hereby Publish and Declare, That Sunday the Ewency sixth day of this Instant July be obferved as a Day of Hublick Thanksgiving to Almighty God throughout Pur Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, for this his great Percy. And The
do Direct and Appoint that this Dur Pioclamation be publicitly Read in all Churches and Chappels on Sunday precedent thereto, to the end that Potice be taken thereof, and due Thanks and
Paralse may upon the said Twenty sixth day of July be offered up unto Almighty God by Us and all
Dur Poople With one Heart, and that humble Supplications be made before him so his continual
Assidance and Improbement of this and all his Hericas to the Honour of his great Pame, and the
Sastep, Peace and Benesit of all Dur Kingdoms and Dominions: We willing and firstly Conmanding all Persons Within these Dur Dominions with all Sodiety, Reverence and Thanksulmels to person this Duty on that day, and to observe the same as becomes so colemn an Octasion.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the Eleventh day of July 1685 In the First Year of Our Reign.
