Hereas it hath pleased Almighty God in the beginning of Dur Reign, to manis telt his great goodnels towards Us and Our Kingdoms, in giving Us lo abfolute and figual Uicozies over the late Revels, who in contempt of the Laws of God, and of these Kingdoms, role up against Us in Dpen Rebellion, threatning the Subversion of the Peace and Tranquility of Our Kingdoms, Whereby it hath pleased him in his infinite mercy not onely to Restore to Us and Dur King. boms a perfect Peace, by an utter Dissipation of all those Revels, but like Wife to deliver into Dur hands the Chief heads of that hourid Traiterous Confpi=

racy, in order to their Condign Bunishment, that thereby nothing might remain to interrupt Dur Peaceable Government for the future. Upon the due Consideration whereof, Wie do with all humility Admire and Adoze the late Percy and Goodnels of God, in giving Uictory to Dur Acms, and Delivering Us and Dur Kingdoms from the Mileries and Calamities that might and conftant. ip do ensue an Intestine and Unnatural Revellion. And considering that such agnal and publick Mercies are Invitations from Heaven to Us and all Dur Subjetts, to render the most publick and cheerful Expressions of Thankfulness to the Divine Goodness: The are willing that the just tribute of Praise and Chanksgiving to Dur Great Soveraign the King of Heaven and Earth, be So-tennily returned by Us and all Dur People for this his late Percy. And to the end some Solemn time may be appointed for the Publick performance of this Duty, that all Dur Subjects in England and Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, who equally have in the Bleffing and Joys of this Deliverance, may be United in the Devotions which are offered for it. The do hereby Publish and Declare, That Sunday the Twenty firth day of this instant July be Observed as a Day of Publick Thanksgiving to Almighty God throughout Our Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, for this his great Percy; And The do Direct and Appoint, That this Dur Proclamation be publickly Read in all Churches and Chappels on Sunday precedent thereto, to the end that Potice be taken thereof, and due Thanks and Praise may upon the said Twenty firth day of July be offered up unto Almighty God by Us and all Our People with one heart, and that humble Supplications be made befoze him for his continual Afficance and Improvement of this and all his Mercies to the honour of his great Paine, and the Safety, Peace and Benefit of all Dur Kingdoms and Dominions: The Willing and Arialy Commanding all Persons Within these Dur Dominions with all Sobriety, Reverence and Thankfulnels to perform this Duty on that day, and to observe the same as becomes so solemnan Decasion.

Given at Our Court at Whitehall the Eleventh day of July 1685. In the First Year of Our Reign.
