E do most Devoucly and Thankfully Acknowledge the great Goodness and Derry of Aimighty God, who hath afforded As his Protection and AMikance in the Jult War, in which, for the Common Safety of Our Realms, and for Dilappointing the Boundless Ambition of France, We are now Engaged, and hath given to Dur Arms, in Conjunction with Our Allies, under the Command of John Earl of Marlborough, Captain General of Our Land Forces, a Monderful and Slozious Current of Success, whereby there bath been gaind from Our Enemies many for tified Towns and large Territories in the Low Countreys; and hath diesce the fleet and Troops of Us and Dur Allies, under the Command of James Duke of Ormond, General of Dur forces on Board Dur laid fleet, and Six George Rooke, Admiral of Dur laid fleet, with the Taking and

and Six George Rooke, Admiral of Dur laid Next, with the Taking and Destroying many Ships of Wax, and great Riches of Dur Enemies, at the Bott of Vigo in the Kingdom of Spain; and has also given Us many considerable Success in the Wefi Indies; and hath rendred Dur Trade at Sea Secure, beyond what could be expected in the time of Wax; and thereby made the beginning of Dur Reign Happy and Properous to Dur Self and Our People; and has likewise given great Success to the Arms of Dur Allies in Germany and Italy: And therefore duly Considering that such great and publick Blettings do call for publick and folemu Acknowledgments, whe have thought sit (by the Advice of Dur Privy Council) to Islue this Dur Royal Proclamation, hereby Appointing and Commanding that a General Thanksgiving to Aimighty God, for these his Percies, be Observed throughout Dur Civies of London and Wesiminster, and its within the Washly Bills of Advictity, upon Thursday the Twelsth Day of this Instant November, and in to, there his Percies, be Observed throughout Our Cities of London and Westminster, ambrillewhere within the Andrews Pills of Portality, upon Thursday the Twelfth Day of this Instant November, and in all other Places throughout Our Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, upon Thursday the Third Day of December next. And so, the better and more Religious and Orderly Solemnizing of the same, We have given Directions to the Archbishops and Wishops of this Our Kingdom, to Compose a Home of Prayer, suitable to this Occasion, to be Ased in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of Publick Anolysis, and to take Care so, the timely Dispersing thereof through their respective Discress. And And do be trially Charge and Command, that the said Hublick Days of Thanksgiving be Religiously Observed by all Our Loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Aimighty God, and upon Pain of suffering such Punishments, as the may justly Instituted all such as shall Content of Personance of the Religious and Peccesary a Duty.
