Taking into Our most Serious Consideration the Monderful and Dappy Conclusion of the Treaty for the Union of Our Two Kingdoms of England and Scocland, (a Mork of so much Difficulty and Ricety in its own Rature, That till now all Attempts which have been made towards it, in the Courte of above an Dundred Pears, have probed Inestecual) which is of the greatest Importance to the Moleculty, Strength, and Safety of the whole Island, and whereby a full Problem is made for the Peace and Aniet of Our People at Home, and for the Security of Our Religion, by a Firm Establishment of the Protestant Successful; And therefore buty Considering that such Great and Bublish Biestings do call so, Publish and Solemn Acknowledgments, we have thought he by the Addice of Our Proby Council to Island out this Our Royal Protesmation, hereby Appointing and Commanding, That a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God so; this his Petry, be Obsterved in such manner as is bettin after Directed and Prescribed, That so both

perroy appointing and Commanding, That a General Thanklgibing to Almighty God for this dieter, be Observed in such manner as is herein after Directed and Directeived, That so both Me and Dur People may Kender most hearty Thanks to Almighty God for this his Derry, and may in most Devout and Solemin Hanner send up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Disbutte Majetry, for Imploring dis Blettings on Our taid Anieto Kingdom, and on the Arms of As and Our Allies, and Our and Their Forces both by Sea and Land, in the Just Mar in which Me are now Engaged for the Common Safety of Our Realms, and for Disappointing the Boundsless Ambient of France, and that he would be pleased to give all Our Subjects bearts disposed to become Our People. To the end therefore that so Religious an Exercise may be Observed at one and the Camp Single. We do hereby durblish and Declares all Our Voting Subjects and Declares. become One People. To the end therefore that so Religious an Exercise may be Observed at one and the same time, The do hereby Publish and Declare to all Our Loding Subjects, and do trickly Charge and Command, That on Thursday the First Day of May next ensuing, this General Thanksgiving hall be Religiously Kept and Observed thoughout England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed. And so the better and more Religious and Oderly Holemnizing the same, set have given Directions so the Archibishops and Bishops of England, to Compose a Form of Prayers furtable to this Occasion, to be Used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of Publick Worship, and to take Care of the timely Dispersing thereof through their respective Diocectes. And we briefly Charge and Command, That the said Publish Day of Thanksgiving be Religiously Observed by all Our Loding Subjects, as they Tender the Favour of Aimighty God, and upon Pain of lustering such punishments as We may suffly Institute on all such as shall Contemn or Neglect the Performance of so Religious and Necessary a Duty.
